you can now enjoy Beethoven's 9<sup>th</sup> Symphony on your phone while you stream how to make hasenpfeffer on the Cooking Channel on TV and then your refrigerator will tell you whether you have all the ingredients...or not. Apparently following your mother's old, stained 3X5 recipe card wasn't good enough! Now our appliances will talk to us.

If you ever feel like technology has gone maybe a little too far, you are not alone. Many of us are bewildered by what our "devices" can or should do for us these days. This world-wide prayer takes place under the theme "The whole Church was fervently praying to God," which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5). internet connection brings us a constant river-flow of data, so our connection to the Lord enables us to live and thrive in His love. Whenever a branch is severed from the main vine or a limb from a tree, it dies and becomes lifeless. Disconnect a smart device and it quickly becomes "dumb" and inert. It won't do what it is supposed to do. Separate any one of us from the Lord, and we wither and die as well. We cease to be able to do what we are supposed to do before God.

This weekend's Scriptures are a reminder for us that God has a purpose for us and that our connection to Christ is meant to provide the lifegiving source of divine nourishment so that we can bear fruit for God's Kingdom. We do this best when God's Word dwells within us, when we can muse and ponder on the Scriptures day and night because they are a part of our daily life.

In the days ahead, continuing to unpack the mystery of Christ's resurrection, let us do everything in our power to stay connected to the very source of our eternal life with God. For even when the cable is out and the WiFi broken, Christ, our life, is still there for us fully and wholly, calling us to new life. In His name may we go and bear much fruit!
