From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we mark once again, the great Feast of Pentecost in the Church, bringing to a conclusion our Easter season. It is an encouraging hallmark of Catholicism that although we are challenged to embrace 40 days of penance and sacrifice during Lent, we follow it up with 50 days of



joyful celebration and festivity after Easter as we unpack the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. This revelry crescendos with the Pentecost event, as we rejoice in the Lord's sending of the Holy Spirit among all believers, uniting us in heart and spirit to proclaim one faith with one voice as One Body in Christ.

The images of Pentecost are many: a great rushing wind, tongues of fire, a universality of languages, an empowerment for mission, many fruits or effects: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. The presence of the Holy Spirit is known to prompt or direct us disciples into speaking, acting and following previously unknown paths to the greater Glory of God. The Spirit unifies, confirms, consoles, strengthens, and emboldens. It is gentle, yet passionate; respectful while always exciting and innovative. The Spirit of God gives purpose and direction.

It is no wonder, then, that we locate this moment as the beginning of the Church—an event that set into motion all that would follow. As the Angel Gabriel once said to Mary, "With God all things are possible," these words are made real through the action of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Speaking to us alone and sometimes "clear out of the blue," or confirmed in a chorus of trusted voices calling us to holiness and faith, the Spirit will lead us through life and guide us to the good things that God has in store for us if only we are docile to Its nudges and delicate coursecorrections. At times, these can be as subtle as a wet towel slapped across our face or as intangible and slight as the tiniest of inner stirrings. God uses the Spirit to get our (Continued on page 4)

IC Haiti News

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

This year's second quarterly collection for IC Haiti will be taken up on the weekend of **May 29–30** (please note new dates). Once again, we appeal to your sincere care for, and steadfast generosity toward, the children and school community of Puit Chacha, Haiti whom we have supported since 2009.

Despite a slight reduction in our quarterly collection totals, the IC Haiti Board of Directors is considering funding two improvement projects that have been requested by our Haitian school community. First is a modest expansion of the school kitchen to provide more prep area for the cooking staff and dining space for the children and, second, is a well. The current well doesn't have enough water to meet all the needs of the school due to a prolonged dry season. An additional well would be most helpful as the whole community shares this resource. We hope to provide you with additional information on these two proposed projects and how to fund them in the near future.

Here are the latest statistics on the number of children whose education IC Haiti has supported throughout this 2020–21 school year:

- 163 students are attending the Fr. Marc Piché elementary school in Puit Chacha.
- 52 students are attending the secondary school in Fond-des-Blancs through our scholarship program.


