Memorial Day

This Monday, May 25, is Memorial Day in our country, a day we set aside to honor those who have given their lives in the service of our nation. In light of very recent guidance from the Governor's Office and from the Archdiocese, we are going to attempt to hold an outdoor Mass on Memorial Day at 9:00 a.m. in St. Mary's Cemetery.

Now, a few things that will be different:

- Unless you have a medical condition that absolutely prohibits it, EVERYONE attending will be required to wear a face mask for the duration of the Mass.
- All parishioners will be required to remain at least 6 feet away from each other (except for immediate household members such as spouses or your own children) and maintain proper social distancing for the entire Mass. (Hint: most gravestones are 6 feet apart from each other—use them as a good guide for spacing everyone out).
- There will be no physical contact between each other before, during, or after Mass. No handshakes, no hugging or embraces. No exceptions!
- Communion will be in the hand only, without any contact from the priest or Eucharistic Minister. The Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- There will be no worship aids distributed at the cemetery.
- During Communion—everyone MUST stay at least 6 feet apart from the person in front of you. Please prepare to be extra patient as it will take longer to receive. Face masks must be kept on until the host has been received in the hand. Then, step-aside at least 6 feet from the priest or Eucharistic Minister, lift you face mask, consume the host, and then replace your face mask before returning to your place.
- When assembling and when leaving, please allow extra time so that you may stay at least 6 feet apart from one another.

And remember—a few other things:

- 1. **Please bring your own chair**. We will NOT be providing any chairs this year.
- 2. Wear appropriate attire for the weather.
- 3. Bring sunscreen, bug repellent, and sunglasses if needed.
- Everyone should have their own supply of handsanitizer—please use it liberally and make sure that you have washed your hands thoroughly before coming to Mass.

If there is any question about weather conditions for Monday morning, please consult our website. We will have word on the site no later than 8:00 a.m. in the event of a cancellation. In the event that Mass cannot be held outdoors in the cemetery, there will not be a public Mass offered in the church—instead it will be LIVE-Streamed privately at 9:00 a.m.

With the Lord's help and blessings, we look forward to welcoming you to our celebration. Please take the extra time to follow the above advice carefully so that everyone may remain safe. If you are of advanced age, have a compromised immune system, or are sick with any form of respiratory illness, we ask that you please remain home and enjoy the Mass (live-streamed) from the safety of your own home.





The Board is happy to report that despite parishioners not being able to congregate for Sunday liturgies, people sent in donations to IC Haiti totaling \$4,467.00 in the first quarter of 2020 and \$3,370.00 so far in the second quarter. We are grateful for this surprising level of generosity given that collections have not been taken up in church due to the pandemic.

May the Lord continue to bless our ongoing efforts to support the people of Haiti. We thank Him for offering us a ministry of service to our brothers and sisters in Christ. In April. IC Haiti sent a \$20,000 donation in response to Health Equity International's request for help to build a COVID-19 triage center adjacent to its hospital complex in Fond-des-Blanc, a few miles north of our school in Puit Chacha. This donation given in the name of the generous people of Immaculate Conception parish was graciously received.

The coronavirus' interruption to year-end celebrations that traditionally mark the end of an educational milestone has spawned creative ways to recognize graduates. In the last few weeks, news stories from across the country have featured the remarkable ways

that congratulatory messages have been delivered to students who are unable to gather for a formal graduation ceremony. Last Friday, the IC teachers and staff took to the streets to deliver lawn signs to the 29 members of the Class of 2020 reading, "Proud Graduate of Immaculate Conception School Class of 2020." Twenty-five staff members divided up into three caravans of cars decorated in balloons, streamers, signs and car window paint—all in the school colors of blue and white, and honked their way across 10 towns in MA and NH to deliver the signs. The parents of the 8th graders had been given the heads-up that there might be some noise coming from the street and that their graduate should come on outside when they heard it. We traveled down tiny one way lanes, disrupting the entire neighborhood with our relentless honking. High Street in Newburyport was typically busy, which was especially fun because so many other cars joined in on the honking as we pulled up to graduate's houses. Strangers who were on walks and people gardening on their front lawns all stopped to wave and clap, sharing the joy of our community's celebration for our graduates. The silver lining is that most graduates were home with their entire family everyone coming outside to take pictures and share a moment with each other after 10 long weeks of separation. We had so much fun! New traditions and meaningful ways to celebrate graduates are being established, which will always remind us of the Class of 2020.

Immaculate Conception Parish owns and operates a private cemetery located on Storey Avenue. 
