### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever had the experience of trying to speak to someone who just isn't listening? Excluding situations where someone may be hearingchallenged or when there is loud background noise, it can be an amazing experience to be speaking



plainly and clearly to a person who is right in front of you and realize that they just aren't listening. You could be talking in Swahili, and they wouldn't notice the difference. For whatever reason, they are completely distracted and have tuned you out for that moment. Sometimes you have to speak their name, loudly, to get them to re-focus on what you are trying to say to them, especially if it is important.

Let's face it, life is full of distractions. This is even more true today than it was in times past, I think. We are surrounded by more advertisements, electronics, music, sounds, and blinking devices than our ancestors could possibly imagine. Yet, listening has always been a human challenge, particularly when it comes to the things of God. Actually hearing God's voice when He speaks is more of an art form than a science, yet is as crucial for us today as it ever was in years gone by. To live well, we must be adept at hearing (and responding) to the Lord's voice when He calls.

Listening involves several key components, I think. To begin with, we must be conscious that God might actually have something to say to us. Do we stop to consider that the Lord has a thought or an idea that He would like to share with us personally, knowing that we would benefit from internalizing it and acting on it? Sometimes we like to put God way out there high in the sky and distant from what is going on here below-concerned only with the bigger problems of the universe, not with my little aches and pains. Yet we believe in an incarnational God, one who embraced every aspect of who we are as humans (except for sin) and knows our human condition even better than we do. That God might occasionally pay attention to our little dramas and concerns is not only possible, but completely consistent with who God has revealed Himself to be through the Scared Scriptures and in history. So, God has a word or two for us!

Using the imagery of sheep, who are highly attuned to the voice of their shepherd, the sheep know that the shepherd will lead them to green pastures for grazing, fresh-flowing water for drinking and safe shelter at night. Over time, they know to trust the voice of the shepherd and they will be the better for it. Trust in this case is earned, not automatic. Yet it becomes reflexive in their actions due to the profound consistency of the leadership of the shepherd. If the shepherd only occasionally led them to food and water or

only every once in a while provided protection, they wouldn't give him the time of day. God has proven Himself to be the ultimate and most trustworthy of leaders. His voice among all others, will be the single source of blessing and shelter.

The shepherd also lives among the sheep, and in a sense, becomes part of their family. In the Incarnation, Jesus has come and dwelt among us, becoming one with our human family, despite our sins and failures. He is known to us and completely accessible in our daily lives, if only we might open our eyes to see and lend our ears to hear. As we continue to celebrate the joy of the resurrection of Christ, we are challenged to recognize our Savior in our midst, looking to experience the subtleties of His movements in our midst. We hear His voice in those who cry out for justice and are unsatisfied with the status quo where others are excluded or devalued. We hear His voice in those who advocate for the hungry, the homeless, the elderly, and the forgotten. We hear His voice calling for peace whenever violence seems to get the upper hand. We hear His voice calling for reform when too few squander the needed resources of this world as too many go without. We hear His voice in those who cannot speak for themselvesamong the unborn, the "unclean," the unloved, and the unwelcome.

His voice is always one of compassion and mercy, of forgiveness and love. It does not judge, but calls us to reconsider our ways when they have strayed from the truth of the created goodness of this world. His voice is always fresh and new, yet comfortingly ancient and familiar. It haunts our dreams, nudges our spirits, and warms our hearts . . . if we might only listen and soak it in.

As the invocation from the Letter to the Hebrews call to us, "If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts." (Hb 4:7) As sheep, we must learn to become better listeners, because God is speaking to us and there is a blessing to be had by paying closer attention to what He has to say.
