



#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

We think too small, our dreams are too limited and our understanding is miserably lacking when it comes to the things of God. That is the honest truth.

I don't know about you, but this past year I have heard of a phenomena called, "COVID dreams." It is the



experience had by many, including myself, of very vivid and crazy dreams that are extremely lifelike and detailed, more like expansive and brilliant motion pictures that go on in our brains while we sleep. It is not necessarily a side affect of having COVID, but rather a result of the unique stress and situation that we have been through as a result of the pandemic shutdowns. Bizarre and colorful at the same time, these dreams can be vast and imaginative. And yet even the best of them will pale in comparison to the reality of who God is and what the fullness of God's Kingdom will be like. Even with the stress of a pandemic to stir our imaginations, God is bigger than our wildest dreams.

Such has always been the case. Next to the incredulity of the Resurrection of Jesus, one of the most amazing mind-stretching over-the-top moments for the early Church was to realize that the Salvation won for us in Jesus was not to be limited to His Jewish disciples, but rather was open to people of all nations and places.

Their whole understanding of who Jesus was came from the Hebrew Scriptures. Everything from imagining Jesus as the new Law-giver like Moses to seeing Him through the eyes of Servant Songs of Isaiah, Jesus was a Jewish Messiah for the Jewish people. Peter was dumbfounded when the Holy Spirit was showered on Cornelius' household and on other gentiles that he would have previously thought were far from the things of God. But no, Jesus, as Peter and all the Apostles would learn, was the complete re-set for all that would follow. The Holy Spirit would go where it would, just like the wind blows from here

This world-wide prayer takes place under the theme "The whole Church was fervently praying to God," which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5).
