From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

It is legend that St. Patrick once used a clover, so common in the fields and pastures of Ireland, to teach the native peoples about the mystery of Holy Trinity. Its (usual) three leaves that make up one sprig is easy enough to symbolize the



three persons of the Blessed Trinity in their uniqueness as well as their unity. Both at the beginning and end of the day, the Trinity is a mystery that we humans will never fully understand, though many bright and well-learned scholars have spent the better portions of their lives plumbing its depths.

Suffice to say for us, the doctrine of the Trinity expresses an inner relationship of who God is. At different moments, we encounter these distinct "personalities" of God. God as Father and Creator of the universe is an image we often associate with the Old Testament, yet Jesus Christ frequently referred to God as His Heavenly Father or as "Abba," roughly and intimately translated as "Daddy." So while there is the notion of God as all-powerful, there is also a distinct tenderness that we have been invited into by Christ. In the Incarnation, we are introduced to Jesus as the Son of God, who took on our human flesh that we might be freed from our sins and have the promise and pledge of eternal life. In Christ, we see our God made-visible and embrace Him as a brother as well as our Lord and Savior. The Holy Spirit of God, present before creation is the moving force of all that is, the breath of God that enlivens and animates. The Holy Spirit is the presence of God who inspires and empowers us to follow God's will and to speak boldly in God's name.

All this we know through God's self-revelation in the Sacred Scriptures. In other words, God has invited us through the writings of the Sacred authors into a deeper understanding and appreciation of who God is, that we might open our hearts more fully to this saving relationship. God takes delight in us, even as we are awed and overwhelmed by God's glory that is revealed in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

So, in the days ahead, pause for a moment, pluck a clover leaf from the ground and ponder the wonder of our God who is one, but three. May God's life and joy resonate in our hearts this day and always!

Would You Like To Be a Lector or Eucharistic Minister?

We are seeking additional Lay Ministers to assist at Mass.

What is an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion? Often referred to as simply a "Eucharistic Minister" or "EM," they are lay people who assist the priest in distributing Holy Communion at Mass. Our priest or deacon is viewed by the Church as the "ordinary minister of Holy Communion," and because of the large number of people attending Mass, it is impractical or impossible for our clergy alone to offer Communion to so many. For this reason, EMs are trained to help. At most Masses at IC, we need 4 or 5 trained EMs which allows the Communion procession to go smoothly. It is an important role! EMs may also volunteer to take the Blessed Sacrament to those who are ill or otherwise unable to attend Mass (nursing homes, hospital, homebound, etc.).

What is a **Lector**? A Lector is a lay person who assists at Mass by reading passages from the Old and New Testament and, when a Deacon is not present, by leading the Universal Prayer or "Prayers of the Faithful."

Both Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers are baptized, confirmed, practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church and living a life of prayer and service within our community.
