From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Many years ago I attended the wake of a family member whom I knew very well. In many ways going into the moment. I was under the impression that I knew everything there was to know about this person. . . their history, life's journey,



challenges, joys, etc. . . . Or so I thought! A pleasant and welcome surprise in the midst of my grieving was to discover a whole treasure-trove of experiences and relationships that this family member had with a wide variety of people that was unknown or that I was only vaguely aware of. Stories were shared, past adventures were recalled and what emerged was a much fuller and, if you will, three-dimensional image of this person, that I still recall with much joy today.

I think of this experience as we enter into the celebration of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend. Over the course of our human history, we have come to know that there is a God, that God is one, or singular, and that God is good and has acted on our behalf to invite us into a saving relationship. But it was only through the Christ-event—namely the Birth, Life, Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ along with the Sending of the Holy Spirit that we have come to know God in a more three-dimensional way, specifically that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This has been revealed to us through Jesus Christ. It is through our immersion into the life of Christ that we are invited to share in this intimate inner-relationship of who God is: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

It is easy to get lost in the depths of a theological treatise on the Trinity. Many a good saint over the centuries have gone mad trying to plumb the depths of what is ultimately a mystery. Yet if we stand in awe before the glory that is our God, we can appreciate the gift that is our triune God, seeing that in God's essence, there is a trifold loving relationship that has taken great pleasure in all of creation and in our divinely-imaged human race in particular. We share the imprint of our Creator!

So, while we will never exhaust the mystery of who God is, we can take joy in knowing that God is more than a dry textbook definition, but rather a life-giving, loving explosion of relationships into which we have been welcomed for all eternity. It is heaven to know, love, and experience this relationship with our triune God in one another.

May God who is Father, Son, and Spirit bless us, our community, families, and friends richly this weekend.

Centering Prayer

If you are searching for the peace the world cannot give please consider joining us at Centering Prayer. Silently resting in God we assent to the Holy Spirit's presence and action in our lives. This act of faith and surrender opens our hearts and minds to God. As we continue to pray, the Holy Spirit moves in the activities and interactions of our daily lives and within us and over time we are transformed.

In Centering Prayer we pray as Jesus prayed. He tells us: "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer each person enters their private room where God is waiting with love.

How often in scripture have we seen Jesus leaving the crowds for the desert or mountain where he can be in communion with his Father in silent prayer. Strengthened and nourished by this time with the Father, Jesus continues to live as his Father wills. Centering Prayer helps us also to say to the Father, "Not my will but yours be done" (Lk. 22: 42).

Centering prayer is a practice and a discipline. Daily periods of silent prayer shift focus from self to God. As God becomes the center of our being the vicissitudes and storms of life affect us less. Living out of God as our Center we experience the peace the world cannot give.

Please consider leaving the noise of world and the busyness of your day behind for an hour on Wednesday evenings from 6:00–7:00 p.m. in Conference Room 209 of the IC Parish Center. Following Centering Prayer, Lectio Divina enriches and instructs us as we listen to and reflect on the words of scripture.
