#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Several years ago I had the chance to vacation in the Smokey Mountains of North Carolina. Having rented a house through Airbnb, I spent many hours relaxing on its back deck that overlooked a mountain range and the valley below.



The Smokey Mountains are well-named, as there always seemed to be a magical wisp of cloud that slowly wrapped itself around the rounded hilltops. The sunsets, as you might imagine, were epic!

In addition to the spectacular view, there also was a birdfeeder on the corner of the deck that attracted an endless array of our feathered-friends, who literally followed a precise "pecking order" for their turn at the feeder. First came the bigger birds—the Blue Jays, Crows and Grackles, all cawing their way to the feast. Then some of the smaller birds could find their way in, Robins, Cardinals with their flash of color, House Finches, Tufted Titmice and Chickadees. Finally, at the bottom of the heap, last to the feast and being clearly intimidated by all the rest, were the common Sparrows who got the leftovers.... I always felt badly for the Sparrows. They were the gentlest of birds, not rude and obnoxious like the Blue Jays and only a third the size of the Blackbirds. They were not spectacularly arrayed like the Bluebirds or Goldfinches of this world. They lacked the curiosity factor of the Hummingbirds who could hover in midair, not quite a bird, yet bigger than an insect. No, the common Sparrow was just that: common and uninspiring, so plain that they could be ignored, so bland that they blended into the backdrop.

Then, fiddling with my camera, I took a closeup picture (which I included on the cover of this bulletin) and it revealed just how beautifully made even this most mundane of God's creatures is. Look at the intricate pattern of feathers on its breast. See the twinkle in its eye. The structure of its beak is perfectly made to grasp a seed. Its delicate legs precisely balanced to grasp a twig, or in this case the edge of the feeder. When you take the time to look closely, you can see the handiwork of the Creator even in the most common and average of birds. Even here, God did not skimp in His design or fail in elegance. The Sparrow is magnificent, if one only takes the time to look!

So what must that say about us? Are we not made in God's image, little less than gods ourselves? Have we not been redeemed in Jesus Christ, given the promise and pledge of eternal life? Has not God's Holy Spirit been poured-out upon us, dwelling within us, that we might more closely follow God's paths, might ever better reflect the great love of God back into the world? Have we not been adopted as sons and daughters of the Most High? Is our inheritance not to be found in Heaven? Is our destiny not to be seated at the great banquet table in God's Kingdom?

From a distance, we human beings can sometimes be crass and insufferable. We judge each other, make generalizations that blur our distinctiveness. We inflict pain and suffering upon countless others, all in the name of

personal gain or momentary advantage. We reduce each other to a number or a statistic, we objectify, stereotype, and profile. The strong lord it over the weak, the clever seek the upper hand over the humble. We suffer from tunnel vision, myopia, and a lack of imagination. We act without thinking and over-think without acting. Sometimes fear paralyzes us. Sometimes we allow misunderstanding to replace critical thought and reflection. Sometimes we see the world in terms of black or white, when the reality is many shades of gray and every color of the rainbow. Sometimes...we just don't bother to care.

And yet, when you look at every human being up close, there is a marvelous work of art that truly exhibits the Master Craftsman's best work. Our bodies are resilient despite their fragility. Our spirits are irrepressible. Our minds can ponder the depths of the oceans, the expanse of the skies, and the vastness of the universe. When we work together, combine our strengths, and compliment the gifts each of us bring to any enterprise...we accomplish greatness and aspire towards a perfection that beckons to us. Within our very souls lies the spark of eternity, a homing beacon to God. We do not rest until we quench that hunger and satisfy that thirst. There is a profound beauty within each human being that manifests the greatness of the God of love. Because in our flesh, we have the amazing capacity to love God back.
