Adult: When you receive Holy Communion and hear the words "Body of Christ" . . . "Blood of Christ," what are some of the thoughts and feelings that surface in you?

Child: How does receiving Holy Communion make you stronger?

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the years, many different changes have been introduced into our liturgy. Many of these have been to enhance or clarify a particular act of worship or embrace a clearer translation of the original Latin text. Sometimes this has



been helpful and at other times it may leave us wondering what all the fuss was about.

One of those subtle, little changes was found several decades ago as the Mass was being translated into English in the wake of the Second Vatican Council. From the Latin text, the priest used to say "Corpus Christi," when offering the consecrated host to a communicant . . . that is, "The Body of Christ." When the use of English came into play, many were translating this phrase, "This is the Body of Christ," as the host was distributed. While it may seem obvious and clear that our faith speaks of the consecrated host as the real presence of the Body and Blood of Christ . . . so to say, "This is the Body of Christ," might appear to be an accurate and true statement . . . it lacks the completeness of the Latin original.

It is a cornerstone of our Catholic Faith that the bread and wine that are prayed-over by the community at Mass do indeed become the Body and Blood of Christ through the action of the Holy Spirit. This mysterious process is known in theological circles as "transubstantiation" and it refers to the reality of the bread and wine changing their inner reality while maintaining their outer appearances of food and drink. So, we honor and reverence the real and true presence of Jesus Christ in the eucharistic elements of bread and wine at Mass.

But more is going on in the communication of these precious gifts at Mass. Today, the minister of Holy Communion is instructed to say, "The Body of Christ" (or "The Blood of Christ" if offering the Chalice). This apparent abruptness of language is meant to help us be more aware of a greater reality made real in our sharing of Holy Communion. Namely, that while the bread and wine have become the Body and Blood of Christ, so, too, the minister of Holy Communion is a member of the Body of Christ, and so, also is the communicant him or herself, a member of the Body of Christ. We affirm and acknowledge this tri-fold awareness of the eucharistic presence of Christ when we say, "Amen" before receiving communion.

That's an awful lot packed into a very few little words! But it does serve to underscore the potent reality of God's enduring presence in our community—through our
