

### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Like many of you, I found myself horrified to once again see images of yet another school shooting this past week, this time out of Uvalde, Texas. There is no other word to describe this wanton butchery than "evil." How another human being can so



callously gun down innocent children and loving, dedicated teachers is beyond my capacity to understand. And yet this pain continues to reverberate through our nation. Again and again and again. Everybody agrees that something has to be done to stop this mindless violence. Not enough of us can come together to agree on exactly what needs to be done or how to do it. And so the carnage goes on and on. What was the famous definition of insanity once attributed to Albert Einstein, "Doing the same thing over and over again, expecting a different result?" Or put another way, "If you always do what you always did, then you always get what you always got." In this case, precious, innocent lives lost, grieving families and yet another community forever torn apart. And we grieve as a nation, too.

This weekend, St. Paul tells us in one of the options for our Second Reading, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." (ICor 12:12). If you have ever had the misfortune of slamming your finger in a car door, you know that while it is your finger that is injured, the pain echoes throughout your entire body. St. Paul's description of the Body of Christ, the Church, is an apt one for us to ponder during this time of national pain. Although we often pride ourselves on our individuality and celebrate each person's uniqueness and autonomy, we are not a society or a nation without embracing а collective identity and responsibility for the common good that goes with it. We each have received the gift of faith from God and we are members of Christ's Body not in isolation, but in our unity with one another. That means that we are all in this together, that our fate is joined with others and together, we either thrive or we perish.

God went to extraordinary lengths to see that we did not die in our sins, but rather, through Jesus Christ, have received the forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life. One might think that this lofty, divine favor that has been lavished on us would spur us to seek better solutions to our problems, to be on a true quest for wisdom and embrace an honest humility that we have not yet found an answer to the pain we once again suffer. Perhaps it is because we have not been asking the right questions.

Back when computers were first being introduced into daily life, there was an old saying, "Garbage-in, garbage-out." In other words, a computer is only as smart as the information that you input. Give a computer a bad set of data and it will inevitably spit out incorrect answers, again and again and again. In human interactions, we have long known that asking the right questions are the keys to knowledge and understanding. Perhaps right now, we need to be seeking

better questions, before we presume to come up with more tenuous answers to this current manifestation of evil or any of the host of others that we entertain as a society and nation.

On this great Feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit in our midst, the Advocate, the Counselor...the One who will teach us all things and remind us of everything that Jesus had said. I am drawn to the text of the Sequence, a beautiful prayer to the Holy Spirit that may help us refocus our minds and hearts that we might seek the Spirit's guidance in the weeks and months ahead:

"Come, Holy Spirit, come!... You, of comforters the best; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. Where you are not, we have naught, Nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour your dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray..." (excerpts from the Sequence)

These past few weeks, have we not needed comfort? Have we not sought solace in our woe? Have we not felt the lack of God's goodness (a classic definition of evil)? Have we not wounds that continue to fester and need healing? Do we not need new strength and resolve? Have we not hungered and thirsted for justice? Have we not wallowed in our guilt for failing to act? Have we not experienced a stubbornness of heart among one another, and lack of unified will? Have we not been frozen in inaction, chilled to lethargy? Have our steps not gone astray?

If there was ever a time when we need the Holy Spirit to do its thing, it is now. Left to ourselves, we fail. But with God, all things are possible. People are sick and tired of being offered "thoughts and prayers" in a time of repeated tragedy. So let's skip the pious thoughts for now and focus instead on getting the prayer right, that we might later be wise and humble enough by God's grace and the inspiration of the Spirit to ask the right questions and maybe, finally, arrive at true answers that can carry us beyond this dreadful time of repeated tragedies in our nation's history.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ Our Lord.

# Would You Like To Be a Lector or Eucharistic Minister?

We are seeking additional Lay Ministers to assist at Mass.

What is an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion? Often referred to as simply a "Eucharistic Minister" or "EM," they are lay people who assist the priest in distributing Holy Communion at Mass. Our priest or deacon is viewed by the Church as the "ordinary minister of Holy Communion," and because of the large number of people attending Mass, it is impractical or impossible for our clergy alone to offer Communion to so many. For this reason, EMs are trained to help. At most Masses at IC, we need 4 or 5 trained EMs which allows the Communion procession to go smoothly. It is an important role! EMs may also volunteer to take the Blessed Sacrament to those who are ill or otherwise unable to attend Mass (nursing homes, hospital, homebound, etc.).

What is a Lector? A Lector is a lay person who assists at Mass by reading passages from the Old and New Testament and, when a Deacon is not present, by leading the Universal Prayer or "Prayers of the Faithful."

Both Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers are baptized, confirmed, practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church and living a life of prayer and service within our community. 




