

## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,



The packing list that Jesus gave His disciples as they were about to go on a preaching journey would put to shame even the most frugal of travelers who “pack light.” A walking stick and sandals...otherwise, nothing. While His instructions might seem odd or even quaint to us today, they were deadly serious directives that made sure His disciples were laser-focused on their mission and how they were to conduct themselves.

No food. This meant that they were utterly dependent on the expected hospitality of the different villages they visited. If they did not receive it, they went hungry that night. It put a strong emphasis on conducting themselves in such a way as to be worthy of receiving the hospitality of the places they visited. No sack. This meant that even if they did find some food along the way, they couldn't carry any excess with them, thus, again, rendering them dependent on the hospitality of each locale. No money. Not only could they not carry any food with them, they weren't going to purchase any along the way either. Again, an absolute reliance on the hospitality of strangers. No second tunic. This meant that they had nothing to barter or trade with. Only the wealthy carried a change of clothing. They were to conduct themselves in poverty.

However, they could carry a stick and wear sandals. The walking stick would not only help them maneuver over uneven ground but also fight off any wild animals or robbers along the way. A necessity of life in First Century Palestine. And sandals served two purposes. The first was to enable them to go long distances over rocky ground. Without them, they wouldn't get far before their feet would have been bloodied and bruised. The second was to enable them to run away from danger or flee from inhospitable villagers who might reject their message.

When looked at in this light, Jesus was setting up the disciples for a highly engaging journey that would either win over the hearts and minds of the places they visited or might well send them running for their lives. So much for the “quaintness” of ministry...This journey, under these circumstances, was going to be exhausting, dangerous, and either highly successful or a miserable failure. There was little room for in-between. Any village seeing the disciples approaching without even the very basics of luggage and amenities would quickly have to make a judgment on whether they were profoundly sincere or just plain crazy. Strike the note of sincerity and they may well be welcomed and listened to. Come off as crazy or reckless and they were just as likely to be shunned, no matter what the dictates of hospitality might demand. So the tone here is to be one of innocence, vulnerability, and humility as they went about sharing the Good News. Is this how we approach ministry in our day and age?

There is a real value in sharing a genuine vulnerability and humility when we speak and attempt to convey something important with others. It disarms the hearer and provides

### Holy Communion in the Hand

Although most of the COVID-related restrictions at Mass have been lifted in recent weeks, one thing we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to *receive Holy Communion only in the hand*. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. This is a temporary restriction that likely will be lifted in the months to come. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.

the possibility that they may lay down their inner defenses and possibly really listen to what is being said instead of reacting to externals or surface issues. How often have we found ourselves distracted by insignificant things and miss the bigger, deeper reality that may also be present? In short, how often do we judge a book by its cover than on the content of its pages? Contained in this instruction is a filter, too, for the community who would hear the disciple's message: get caught up in their loony way of going about travelling and you are not worthy of hearing so rich a message. Look beyond the outer appearance and into their hearts and there is treasure to be had, indeed!

As we move deeper into our summer months, the Scriptures call to us to examine how we present ourselves to others and bring others to Christ. Too much baggage and we struggle through the terminal on the way to our journey. Pack too much attitude in the way we approach people and we disenable others from hearing our message. Project an air of self-reliance and we fail to give others a place to contribute to the cause. And if we think even for a second that we can go this journey on our own without the help of those we are called to serve, then we are left gasping from the very beginning.

So sandals and walking stick, to keep us humble and focused on what God will do through others, for the sake of others...that they, too, might come to know and love the Lord.

## Saving Our Bees Presentation

*Dr. Robert Gegear, U-Mass Dartmouth*

*Laudato Si Series*

In 2015, Pope Francis issued the encyclical, *Laudato Si, Care for our Common Home*, in which he expressed a sense of urgency "to every person living on this planet" about the environmental challenges we face as a global community.

Holy Redeemer - Immaculate Conception Collaborative, under the guidance of Carol Robertson, owner of Garden Imprint and a member of the Parish Pastoral Council, will be introducing a series of presentations and discussions on various environmental issues with the hope of engaging the community in field projects locally.

The next presentation will feature Dr. Robert Gegear from UMass Dartmouth and founder of the Beecology project (<https://beecology.wpi.edu/website/home>).

For almost two decades, pollinators have been declining at an unprecedented rate. These declines pose a **significant threat** to environmental health. Biologist Dr. Gegear will describe his research on bumblebees and will discuss why native plants are important for our ecosystems. During his presentation, you will learn:

- how our society can better **protect** native pollinators and plants
- how conservation organizations can develop strategies for restoring pollinator habitat
- how gardeners can "Go Native" and help conserve the pollinators and plants that we depend upon, and
- practical information you can pass along to members of your community


