

Holy Communion in the Hand

Although most of the COVID-related restrictions at Mass have been lifted, one thing we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to receive Holy Communion only in the hand. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. This is a temporary restriction that likely will be lifted in the months to come. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.

Celebrating the life of St. Ann(e) in West Newbury



According to Christian tradition, St. Anne (or Ann) was the mother of Mary and the maternal grandmother of Jesus. She is not mentioned in the four canonical Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, but her story is told in early church texts written in the second and third centuries. From early times, she was honored in both Eastern and Western Christianity. A church was built in her honor in 550 AD in Constantinople and in the 700s, a fresco was painted in her honor in the church of Santa Maria Antiqua in Rome.

The tradition says that Anne was born in Bethlehem in Judea. She married Joachim from Nazareth and together they shared a wealthy and devout life in Jerusalem. But they grieved because they had no children. Like the barren Hanna in the Old Testament story of her conception of the prophet Samuel, Anne promised God that, if she conceived, she would dedicate her firstborn child to God's service. An angel appeared to announce that Anne would conceive Mary, a child who would be blessed by all the world.

At the same time, her husband Joachim, who had been turned away from offering sacrifice at the Temple because he was childless, went to the mountains to pray to God for a child. The angel then also appeared to Joachim and made the same promise. When Joachim returned, Anne went to meet him at the Golden Gate of Jerusalem, as instructed by the angel. They shared their stories of the angel's message and went home rejoicing. The Orthodox icon of "The Conception of the Virgin Mary" depicts Anne and Joachim embracing at the city gates. The upper left and right corners of the icon show Anne's and Joachim's encounters with the angel. In the Roman Catholic Church, the Feast of Saints Anne and Joachim is celebrated on July 26.

According to one ancient tradition, when the child Mary was three years old, Joachim and Anne, in fulfillment of Anne's promise to dedicate the child to God, brought Mary to the Temple in Jerusalem, where they left her to be brought up. The dedication of Mary at the Temple became so important in church tradition that by 1585, Pope Sixtus V declared it a liturgical feast of the Presentation of the Virgin Mary (November 21). It is still observed as a Memorial in the Church calendar. Anne is said to be the aunt of Elizabeth, who became the mother of St. John the Baptist. And one tradition holds that St. Anne died in Jerusalem at the age of 79, before the Annunciation and birth of Jesus.

St. Anne is the patron saint of unmarried women, married women, women in labor, childless people, and grandmothers (also lace makers, equestrians, miners, the poor, and seamstresses). She is honored as a mother who cares for the needs of her spiritual children. As the mother of the Virgin Mary and the grandmother of Jesus, St. Anne was venerated as a woman of great virtue and love. The ancient Greek icon "The Holy Motherhood" depicts Anne holding Mary on her lap while Mary holds Jesus on her lap.

In later artistic renderings, St. Anne is often shown seated with a book on her lap. The child Mary stands against her, eager to listen and learn. Our St. Ann Church's stained glass window (on the bulletin cover) shows Ann with a book. Her statue there (see above) shows her standing with a book and an attentive child Mary beside her. God entrusted to St. Anne the task of raising Mary in a holy and virtuous home, and from a very young age, Mary looked to St. Anne to learn about God and how God works in the lives of those who love and serve him.
