#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

There is a wonderful scene at the beginning of the 1997 movie, *Titanic*, where Leonardo DiCaprio's character, Jack Dawson, is involved in a high-stakes poker game. It is the final hand, each player has thrown-in everything of worth



that he had (including a pair of tickets for the ill-fated ship's maiden voyage), the bet was called and Jack declares, "Somebody's life is about to change!" I guess I can't print Jack's friend's response in Italian, thinking they had lost everything, but luck was shining (or not) on Jack and Fabrizio that day. They won everything, including the tickets and their fate was set as they boarded the famous liner on its first and last voyage across the sea.

Well, that was fiction, the storyline in the movie, that is. But the idea of going "all-in," of betting everything, including one's future on a single moment of chance is the stuff of many a human drama over the ages. The founding fathers of our nation ended the Declaration of Independence with this line: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor." Little did they know just how much they were betting. Many of them would indeed lose their fortunes, their homes, and even their lives in pursuit of this illustrious goal. Decades later, Harriet Tubman, the famous abolitionist and former slave, was "all-in" when she risked everything to rescue approximately 70 people from slavery, leading them to freedom on what is now known as the "Underground Railroad." Of her, Frederick Douglass once wrote, "The midnight sky and the silent stars have been the witnesses of your devotion to freedom and of your heroism. Excepting John Brown—of sacred memory—I know of no one who has willingly encountered more perils and hardships to serve our enslaved people than you have."

About a hundred years later, another great American, Neil Armstrong, was "all-in" when in 1969, almost out of rocket fuel, he committed his fragile lunar lander, the *Eagle*, to proceed over a rocky debris field and be the first human being to successfully land on the moon. His often repeated quote, "That's one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind," was the understatement of the century.

This human ideal of throwing caution to the wind and fully committing oneself to a particular cause in order to reap great rewards has the fingerprints of God all over it, I think. It is the lesson of Abraham and Isaac, of Moses leading the people of Israel from slavery to freedom, of the prophets daring to utter God's Word in opposition to all that has been established...of John the Baptist's call to repentance and of Jesus' own sacrifice on the Cross. All-in. Totally committed. Nothing held back.

It is in this same light that we must hear the parable of the great pearl. To experience the fullness of God's Kingdom, we must open ourselves to it completely, be willing to sell and divest ourselves of any other thing of value in order to possess it. God's Kingdom is just that good! It is worth THAT much. It is worth that incredible level of risk. And when we do, as Jack's character in the movie once uttered, our lives will change. We will open ourselves to a kind of love that can barely be put into words. We will live in a way that is completely transformed. We will breathe in a more complete way than we ever could imagine even after tyranny is defeated. We will be free that goes well beyond the removal of mere earthly shackles or institutional racism. We will soar into the heavens to an exponentially higher realm than any human contraption could ever propel us.

In God's Kingdom, the very meaning of life itself will be transformed. We will be God's cherished and redeemed daughters and sons forever. It is indeed a pearl of great price!

God has always been all-in for us. What is our level of commitment to the Lord today?

### **Neighbors Helping Neighbors**



Each Lenten season, HRIC collects care packs from parishioners for distribution to the homeless on Holy Thursday. Items in 2020 were in the process of being collected at the time of the pandemic surge in Massachusetts. Churches were closed, guidelines from the Archdiocese

limited any external community activities, and receipt of care packs was discontinued. Over the last five years, approximately 1,000 care packs of toiletries, socks, and personal care items have been distributed to a variety of charitable organizations throughout the greater community.

Many of the local organizations served by our program in the past have suspended operations temporarily or have had to modify or redirect efforts on behalf of their clients.

Lazarus House Ministries, located in Lawrence, has been one of the recipients of the care packs program. They are a gospel-based ministry operating since 1983 and welcome all in need in the name of God. The care they provide encompasses food, shelter, clothing, advocacy, education, work preparation, a listening ear, a welcoming heart, and the restoration of dignity and self-respect to people who are poor and in dire need. The amount of people seeking help from Lazarus House has risen from 1,000 served to over 2,000 as a result of the pandemic.

In early July, over 80 care packs were delivered to Lazarus House from our Collaborative. They were received by Ellen Bedrosian with overwhelming gratitude. Many of their clients have lost their jobs, are living on the streets and some of their only meals come from the daily offerings from Lazarus House.

Lazarus House Executive Director, Jeffrey Hassel, explains his dedication to the outreach of his organization, "I am a pastor whose passion is stepping outside of the walls of the church to serve." His message reminds us of our call to service in Matthew 25:40..." Amen I say to you, as long as you did it to one of these my least brethren, you did it to me".

Thank you to everyone who contributed to this year's care packs program. Know that your generosity and compassion is loving evangelization and an example of St. Francis' direction to "preach the Gospel, use words when necessary". May God continue to bless you and your loved ones.



### **IC Haiti**

#### The next collection for IC Haiti is scheduled to be taken up on the weekend of August 1-2.

The Board of Directors is pleased to inform you that despite our inability to take up scheduled collections in March and May many parishioners sent in their donations via U.S. Mail. We are most grateful to all who did so.

Back in April we made a donation of \$20,000 to help the hospital in Fond des Blanc build a separate Covid-19 unit. Since that time, parishioner donations have more than made up for that donation. In early July we received the following encouraging update from a representative of the hospital:

The hospital has now seen 136 cases of confirmed or suspected COVID-19, although at the moment there are just three patients hospitalized in the COVID-19 unit on campus. We are also doing contact tracing and surveillance for another 40+ cases at the community level through our network of community leaders and community health workers. Staff and patients/visitors are required to wear masks at all times on campus, and staff working with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 patients are required to wear PPE including masks, eye shields, face shields, shoe covers, and gowns. I'm pleased to share that we have not had any hospital-based transmission of COVID-19 to staff members, which reflects well on our commitment to infection control protocols. We are in constant contact with infectious disease experts at MGH and Brigham & Women's who are helping us to update our protocols as needed and in accordance with the emerging best practices of health centers around the world on the front lines of the crisis.

Again, thanks to all who have continued to support IC Haiti during these troubling times. We expect to hear soon how the Fr. Marc Piché Elementary School in Puit Chacha will proceed for this coming school year. The Board of Directors has approved the payment of salaries for the teachers and staff even if the school doesn't operate as it normally would due to the pandemic.

### **Immaculate Conception School**

Choosing the right high school is part of the fall experience for 8th grade students at the IC. For some, the obvious choice has been unfolding for years. Family connections to area high schools and New England boarding schools provide some with the opportunity to continue a



family legacy. Some approach high school in search of new opportunities while others look to continue current areas of interest. Despite each child's unique circumstances, area secondary schools are eager to share information with our families. It is a well-known fact that IC students are prepared for the demands of high school, have a strong work ethic, are dedicated to community service, and are eager to get involved beyond the classroom. Pictured is the annual IC High School Fair, attended by 28 New England private high schools and boarding schools, where admissions representatives shared their schools with our middle school families.



The coronavirus pandemic has forced many adjustments to the school experience. Gatherings, such as a high school fair, must be redesigned to bring an end result through a new process. Finding new ways to navigate the admissions process is a challenge that the IC is already tackling, to best guide the educational experience of our students after graduation. Students in 7th and 8th grade were recently asked about plans for high school. The results have provided the school office with feedback that will assist us in connecting families with schools of interest. Twenty-five families responded to the survey, sharing the types of schools that interest our students. Eighty-eight percent of our students are interested in continuing in Catholic education, 66% are considering public high school, and 64% want to know more about private day schools. (Student answers reflect all types of schools they are considering.) No one indicated they are considering a boarding school at this time.

The top three Catholic high schools of interest were Central Catholic in Lawrence (82%), Bishop Fenwick in Peabody (73%), and St. Thomas Aquinas in Dover, NH (55%). Other area Catholic high schools of interest were Austin Prep in Reading, Malden Catholic, St. John's Prep in Danvers, and St. Mary's in Lynn.

Sixty-four percent of the students surveyed were interested in private day schools. Schools peaking the most interest were Governor's Academy (56%), Phillips Exeter Academy (44%) and Bradford Christian Academy and Phillips Academy-Andover, both at 38%. Other private schools of interest were Pingree, Portsmouth Christian Academy, Berwick Academy, Waring School, Brooks School, Whittier Technical School, and Essex Technical School.



Visiting any school can provide a "feel" for the environment that speaks beyond factual information and program offerings. Meeting students, faculty, and admissions teams can prompt a sense of belonging and connection that truly means something when students envision where they want to spend the next four years. School "shadow days" and open house events may not be an option in the months to come, so individualized admissions sessions are being planned as an alternative. An abundance of top-notch high schools and private day schools are eager to connect with our students, which makes finding the right high school a little easier for the Class of 2021. The IC administration and faculty play an integral part of helping students find the right fit for high school, fostered by strong working relationships with high school admissions teams and knowing the interests, academic strengths, and personality of every one of our students. An education at Immaculate Conception School lays the foundation for lifelong learning, showing compassion for others, and contributing to a community of caring people.






