#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

The image of a yoke—that instrument by which beasts of burden are connected together to drag or carry heavy loads—is one that conjures up pastoral scenes of imagined farm life and other rural settings. How quaint, we might think?!



Last year, members of my family had gathered at Sturbridge Village out in Western Massachusetts for an engagement party for my cousin. After the meal and celebration, we had the opportunity to tour the village which was a throwback to life in the early 19th century: no electricity, no internet and no air conditioning! Did I mention that it was a hot day? But at one point we encountered a few of the staff working in the field and they were using two yoked cows to move a wagon of hay. In the age before internal-combustion engines, this was how it was done. The cows didn't seem to mind it too much. They even seemed bored out of their minds. Eventually, they would get some water and hay to eat, I imagined. But it was no way to live, I thought to myself. Cows ought to be free to do...well, what cows do, right?! Then again, who am I to say. I know absolutely nothing about cows or 19th century farm life, even after a very interesting afternoon in Sturbridge.

Yokes have been around for millennia. They helped transform human labor when our ancestors realized that they could combine the strength of many animals to transport things that we only dreamed about moving before. Then, too, yokes have been also used on our fellow human beings from century to century as slaves were once bound together to common work.

It is perhaps this latter notion of a yoke—that which binds and burdens—that we most recoil from. If someone is feeling as though they are bound by a yoke, it means that they are not free to act on their own, that some external power has them captive and they have lost their most cherished freedom. It evokes feelings of despair and hopelessness. The human spirit dies when we are yoked. Sometimes our modern burdens are referred to in this way: the yoke of debt, taxes, family obligations, and work responsibilities—all these can stifle our inner quest for relief and freedom. We sometimes refer to the heavy burden of governing as the yoke of office. Which one of us hasn't felt like a yoke was placed upon everyone in this time of pandemic? Yokes restrict, coerce, and force us to follow a path not our own.

With all these negative connotations of yokes, it can seem curious, then, that Jesus would invite us to rejoice in willingly taking on His yoke. Wouldn't He rather have us run free? Why use the image of forced labor to draw people to Himself? So what if His yoke is easy and burden light—it's still a yoke, isn't it? Why not run away from God who would yoke us and run free? Well, haven't we tried that for millennia? Haven't we tried to live our lives "our way," whichever way that was from one age to the next? Haven't we tried to build a better world, improve upon the condition of our human nature, grow and evolve into something

better? How's that working for us these days? Are we really better off when we do our own thing with no reference to what God would have us do? I'm not sure that any one of us could honestly say that we human beings are better off on our own. Sure, we might have refrigerators and karaoke, but those things only get us so far.

One of the aspects of yoking that merits our attention is the fact that together, we can accomplish more than if we were each left to do our own thing. Historically, we have come together time and again to accomplish great tasks that otherwise would be impossible. We grew crops through domestic cooperation. We built cities through a willingness to become interconnected with the varied skills and talents that no one individual could alone possess. Whether lashed together or not, our working in concert with one another enables us to do the great things that individuals could not fathom or ponder alone. Which one of us, by ourself, could ever fly into space and land on the moon?

I think it is in this way that the Lord invites us to take on His yoke—a light burden to bear, if we all work together in His name. Unlike the many domesticated animals we have pressed into service over the years, the Lord gives us a choice whether to accept this responsibility of following Him. With the Lord guiding or ordering our efforts, it is always done with love and mercy, compassion and forgiveness. With the Lord directing our work, we labor for something greater than ourselves. With God as the true Master of the Universe, our efforts go to build something that will truly last. Working together, in harmony for the Kingdom, we see that our true citizenship lies in Heaven. With God as the Master builder, we can be confident that we do not labor in vain. No cow ever had it this good!

As we enjoy these lazy summer days and celebrate the birth of our nation, let us reflect on the many freedoms we enjoy in our country and the even greater blessings that are to come through sharing in the yoke of discipleship in Jesus Christ.

What a joy to celebrate Mass together again and what an interesting several months it has been as we worked to ensure a safe return to worship. It has been wonderful to see everyone and to once again be together at the Lord's Table

A great deal of work has gone into reopening for worship and it was certainly timely of the Parish Council as this group has been working diligently behind the scenes for several months. While Parish Council was initially formed to advise on matters of the Collaborative, Providence stepped in to provide willing hands to respond to the challenges of the pandemic in our communities.

Helping with the live stream Mass from St. James Chapel, developing the *Neighbors Helping Neighbors* program to reach out to those in need, continuing our spiritual education with the introduction of Flocknote and Engage/Word on Fire have resulted from the Council's early work. We are grateful indeed for the expertise which resulted in the development and launching of the Mass registration tool where we now can welcome up to 80 people at Immaculate Conception and 25 parishioners at St. Ann each week.

Reopening for Mass would not have happened so soon had it not been for the many other volunteers who have stepped in to ensure a smooth and safe return. From greeting and the management of weekly attendance to the health and safety protocols which dictate how the church is cleaned, your brothers and sisters have made it possible for all of us to be in physical communion, despite the challenges of face masks and social distancing.

There have been a few bumps along the way and we thank everyone for their patience and understanding as we work through these issues. Many of these protocols are dictated by the Commonwealth and the Archdiocese and we will continue to see changes until we can safely return to whatever our "new normal" will be.

So, for now, don't forget to register each week on the website, the Facebook page, or by calling the offices. Sanitize before coming to Mass, wear your mask and respect the 6 ft. social distancing guidelines. Stay tuned for future updates on changes to the Mass schedule and the reopening of a newly renovated Nativity Church.


