From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

After more than 28 years of ordained ministry, I can honestly say there have only been a handful of times that my "peace has been returned to me," as our Gospel indicates can happen. I think in the extreme of these cases



there has been some combination of uncontrolled mental illness, raging obstinacy, or a profound misunderstanding. For the rest, as Abraham Lincoln once quoted the poet John Lydgate, "You can please some of the people all of the time, you can please all of the people some of the time, but you can't please all the people all of the time." Such is human nature, I guess.

But I have to say, most people have a radical openness to the Gospel message when they hear it anew, as if for the first time. I see this regularly at funerals. Although many who are present for these moments may have been baptized many years ago, so often a majority do not regularly attend Church or practice their faith in any formal way. But my experience is that they receive the message of Jesus Christ with a surprisingly docile heart. If we stop and think about it, we Christians have the best message in the world: God loves us so much that He is willing to forgive all of our sins and shortcomings and instead give us the pure gift of eternal life in Heaven with Him through the saving action of His Son, Jesus Christ. All we really need to do in this world is try to do our best to love Him back... and we do this most closely by loving others. It is not a bad message to receive, whether we are in the midst of grief or enjoying the many blessings that life has to offer.

Jesus' instructions to His disciples as they went on a short mission were meant to keep them focused on their utter dependency before God. Don't carry heavy provisions so that you won't need to rely on (and celebrate) the generosity of others. Don't carry sandals, so that you can easily run away from difficulties. Don't greet people along the way and become distracted in long diversions that could easily derail the work that must be accomplished. Don't move from house to house, seeking better and better accommodations. Be satisfied with the hospitality that is offered, realizing that it might well represent a huge sacrifice on the part of your hosts. So, dependency, steadfastness, determination, humility, and gratitude are all qualities that we disciples must internalize to be successful in proclaiming the Kingdom of God. And even then, our offer of peace will be returned to us on occasion. . . just because.

As we have celebrated our nation's independence this week and are enjoying the many blessings of summer, may we strive in an ever greater way to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with others along our way, rejoicing above all that we have been included in the promise that is Heaven.

Say No to Roe

Many people may not be informed of this latest bill being proposed by Massachusetts lawmakers. This bill, The Roe Act S1902/H 3320 is due to be voted upon soon. "The Roe Act" overhauls the abortion code contained in Massachusetts General Law thus creating a right to unrestricted abortion. (Dr. David Franks of masscitizensforlife.org)

What does this mean? Why should we be concerned?

- Eliminates parental consent requirements for minor girls seeking an abortion
- Expands taxpayer funding of abortion
- Refuses legal protection to infants who survive an abortion thereby allowing for passive infanticide
- Eliminates the requirements that abortions after the first trimester be performed in the hospital
- Allows for late-term and full-term abortions (from masscitizensforlife.org)




