From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Having just returned from a little time away from the Collaborative, I was able during my vacation to enjoy some saltwater fishing. A friend was kind enough to invite me out on his boat and over several days on the waters of Cape



Cod Bay and Nantucket Sound we caught stripers, bluefish, black sea bass, and flounder. Oh, and few dogfish along the way, miserable little mini-sharks that they are! Since I rarely have the opportunity to do this, it was refreshing and relaxing in a wonderful way, despite the "o-dark-thirty" launch time. The amazing sunrise over water, refreshing salt air, the constant balancing effort on a moving boat, the ever-so-slight finesse of coaxing that first nibble on the line, then the furious reeling-in and final, frenzied capturing of the prized-catch and its eventual journey to my dinner plate later that day...all combined to make for a thoroughly pleasing experience.

You know, I suspect that there are a very large number of moments like this that I would enjoy and even find myself engrossed in regularly, if given the chance. Surely, I would eventually tire of one and move on to the next, but our world is so big and varied and our lives so relatively short, it is not inconceivable that a person could spend their entire lifetime moving from one activity or distraction to the next, enjoying the momentary satisfactions as they came. This would be a mostly satisfying way to live one's life, I think.

I say mostly satisfying because anyone who has ever seriously tried to do this (the classic definition of hedonism) inevitably runs into the reality that there are some desires and inner longings that no worldly endeavor or activity could ever fully quench. St. Augustine captured this reality well when in his *Confessions*, he says, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless, until they can find

rest in you." In short, he points to the inescapable truth that no matter how hard we may try, there is an indelible mark of our Creator etched into every human heart that can only be completed by union with the Divine. In other words, if you want to live a fully-authentic, completely-satisfied human life...you must actively seek and embrace God's presence in the midst of every other good thing. And seeking that presence means that from time-to-time, it will be necessary to forgo a temporary, earthly good to pursue an eternal one. Sacrifice is essential to the life of a disciple.

Jesus speaks to this in this weekend's Gospel passage when He says, "What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" (Mt 16:26) Our life, then is found not in a seemingly endless pursuit of distractions—no matter how wonderful or refreshing they may be—but rather in opening our hearts to God's love and following the perfect expression of that love, Jesus Christ. Only there do we find the ultimate and eternal joy of being in communion with the God who can give us all things and enable us to be truly alive.

While I do hope to eventually do some more fishing and open myself to many other wonderful experiences that life in the years ahead may offer, the greatest blessing any of us will ever have is the one that we have already received—that inner longing for our Creator given at birth that will lead us home. May no earthly distraction prove to be an obstacle to our following the true path that leads us to life.
