From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I want to take a moment and thank everyone who helped and participated in Fr. Broderick's funeral services this past week. Whether you were able to join us in person or through our live-streamed video, I am grateful to so many who



helped to commend our dear friend to the Lord. I received many wonderful comments about the music—even though we were not permitted to have a full choir on hand for the celebration, the musicians who played and the cantors who sang did a wonderful job bringing comfort and peace to the moments in the church. I am grateful, too, to everyone who helped behind the scenes greeting, cleaning, and serving as Lectors. I am certain that Fr. Broderick is praying for all of us and I look forward, with you, to a time when we can all be together again.

As this weekend's Second Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans reminds us, "For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living." (Rom 14:8-9) When we encounter death and loss our faith is challenged and our world often turned upside down. But we must remember that for God, nothing has changed. When the Lord looks at us, He sees us in our entirety—past, present, and future—and loves and redeems it all. With God there is no time, only the eternal present moment of His glory. This is what we commonly call, "Heaven." St. Paul uses this vision to remind us of our faith when we must confront death and grief. In his Letter to the Thessalonians that we often share at funerals, he says this:

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words. (I Thes. 4:13-18)

As Fr. Broderick was so knowledgeable about the Scriptures and St. Paul's writings, these words would have been very familiar to him and surely fueled his hope for resurrection and eternal life. May they encourage us in the days ahead as well.




