

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This past week, along with more than 50 brother priests, I attended a refresher course on child safety and protection policies in our parishes. This was a required training course for priests and is part of the Archdiocese's commitment to



protecting children and the vulnerable in our worship spaces and parish life. It was time well-spent. I had attended a similar course many years ago, and was glad to have the update and reminder of all that we need to be doing to keep our parish communities as safe as possible for our young people.

One of the fundamental requirements that we have from the Church's child-protection policies is that all volunteers who function in any capacity within the Church or parish life that may put them in contact with minors must be CORI-ed by the state every calendar year. This includes Priests, Deacons, Bishops, all lay church or school employees, Lector's, Eucharistic Ministers, Adult Altar Servers, Choir Members, Musicians, Greeters, and Ushers among others. Even if the chance of interaction with minors or the vulnerable is remote, the Archdiocese still requires this background check **annually**. It is good common sense that we embrace and cooperate with this basic level of safety and protection.

I know that it can seem like "we are always doing this," that it can feel like it was only a few months ago that we may have filled-out a form. It may also feel intrusive to be sending out such personal information in a an age when privacy concerns are rampant. It is important to remember that we give out our personal information regularly to conduct all sorts of business and financial transactions and that our social media regularly broadcast even more personal data than what is asked for by the Church—such as location data and even who our friends are. I think we have to acknowledge that this is part of the landscape of the world we live in and that if we want to be a minister in the Church in 21st-Century America, this is what we must do.

To help us fulfill this requirement from the Church, Deacon Paul Dow and his wife, Maureen, have offered to help us fill out these forms and submit them to the Archdiocese in a timely manner. In the weeks ahead, they will be offering several opportunities in all three of our churches to fill these out after Mass and have them verified by a driver's license or other government-issued ID.

If you have very recently (in the last few weeks) filled out a CORI form and submitted it, then you are all-set until next year. If not, then this is an excellent opportunity to get it done conveniently as you leave church. Deacon Paul and Maureen will be working with all of the existing ministries within our Collaborative to compile an accurate list of all volunteers who work in our many various committees to

Meet the Ministry

St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Societies of HR and IC

What is the St. Vincent de Paul society? Most of us are



familiar with a mention of St. Vincent de Paul society within our parishes. Donations are requested at Mass throughout the year along with solicitations to support its mission through the Annual Walk for the Poor.

But, are we really aware of the good works done by our volunteers to provide practical help to our neighbors throughout Merrimac, Newbury, Newburyport, and West Newbury?

- A husband and wife with disabilities and long-term illness have insufficient income to pay the bills. A car repair bill leaves the family unable to pay such necessities as rent, food, and utilities. SVdP provides interim support to keep this family afloat.
- A single woman, with serious illnesses, has many medically-related expenses which are not covered by insurance, as well as co-pays for a growing list of medications. Gas and parking expenses mount for her frequent trips to hospitals. SVdP provided gift cards for food, gas, and pharmacy over several months.
- A senior gentleman had two recent back surgeries and then needed a new mattress and sitting chair to help in recovery. Living on a minimal fixed income, he couldn't afford them. SVdP was able to help him with these unforeseen medically related expenses.
- At the weekly Breaking Bread Meal, SVdP prepares and serves a home-cooked, three-course meal every Tuesday to anyone wanting a good, hot meal and fellowship. SVdP volunteers serve an average of 30– 40 guests each week.

These few examples merely scratch the surface in conveying both the countless hours of service by these selfless volunteers, as well as their practical, life-changing impact on the lives of the clients they serve. Through individual acts of service, each SVDP volunteer shows the face of Jesus to those in need in our communities. They welcome you to do the same. Whether manning the help line, assessing client needs, organizing events, or being a sympathetic ear—is the ministry of St. Vincent de Paul calling you? 
