From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

What is your most treasured possession? It is a challenging question! A friend was recently asked this question in the process of buying insurance for her home. Her response was, "My faith, of course!" (Yeh! Somebody was paying



attention in church!) This was not quite what the insurance agent had in mind, but being a believer herself, entertained the question for a while, also managing to secure the proper coverage for her and her family. The agent, no doubt, was looking for something like, "my pearl necklace," or "our original Rembrandt painting." But the question is a haunting one. What do we cling to and value more than anything else?

While people in Jesus' time and place certainly had material possessions and the wealthy clung to gold and silver...the greatest commodity that was ever traded or possessed was: Honor. A certain amount of honor was ascribed to everyone by birth. For example, as John and Mary's son, you followed in the honorable trade or livelihood of your family. Thus if your father was a carpenter, you became a carpenter as well. Do something different, and you might well lapse into shame by rejecting your given honorable familial occupation. Honor could also be acquired, if a person were to win an argument in the public arena. In a culture where everyone knew everyone else's business and everyone was always watching what everyone else was doing and saying, if a dispute came up (as they often did) to win the riposte was to gain honor and esteem from all those around you. Do this often enough and your "net worth" increased greatly in the eyes of others. Treat others, especially family and friends with proper respect, you maintained your honor. Gain even more honor by virtue of your generosity towards those in need or your mercifulness to those in debt to you...well, then you became a truly wealthy person in ancient times regardless of how many shekels might be in your bank account.

It is in this light that this weekend's "Parable of the Two Sons" must be heard. Given that true wealth was not found so much in the quantity of commodities that one possessed, but rather in always maintaining, seeking and gaining honor before others, this Gospel passage was likely very disturbing for Matthew's audience to engage. While working in the vineyard was important, what was even more vital was honoring your father—especially in public where everyone could see and hear. It was egregiously disrespectful and grossly shameful to say "no" to your father in front of others. This was so offensive, no matter what else happened after that, even if that son worked the next 20 years tirelessly in the field without complaint, he

would always be known as the one who shamed his father. His fate was sealed.

The other son, however, even though he did not ultimately obey his father that day, would have preserved his honor and that of his father. No work in the vineyard would get done, but everyone went home in peace that night, though there may have been a private conversation between father and son later about why the grapes were wilting on the vine....

This is the human, earthly take on the parable. But Jesus is always inviting us to look for more than mere human wisdom in considering these time-honored stories. God, who is the father-figure in the parable, really wants the work to get done in the vineyard! It is not just a nice, secondary thing if it were to happen, but is an essential, critical action that must be performed...even in the face of shame, anger, disappointment and disgrace. It is all about actually doing the father's will, not just maintaining the appearance of such before others. Anybody can look good from time to time, especially when they know others will be watching... but can they do the good that is required of them when no one is looking? That is the real challenge!

For Matthew's Jesus, doing the Will of His Heavenly Father is the ultimate honorable action, no matter how many times we have said, "no" in the past. And when we truly honor the Lord, then we gain something of immeasurable value that no earthly crowd...or insurance company could ever put a price tag on: faithfulness. That, we will see, opens the door to every other blessing that God might ever shower upon us—now or in the life to come.

So, what is your most treasured possession?

Meet Fr. Stanley

I'd like to take a moment to introduce myself. My name is already known by some, Fr. Charles Stanley; and I am probably known as "the new retired priest" living in the rectory. I spent the last 17 years in Peabody MA, in the position of pastor.



Let's go back to the beginning: I was born in Lynn, MA, went to a parochial elementary school and parochial high school there: St. Jean Baptist.

After ordination to the priesthood, my first assignment was in Dracut at Ste. Therese. From there I entered the Missionary Society of St James the Apostle and served in Peru in the high altitude towns of Andahuaylas and Huancarama.

I returned to an assignment here in the archdiocese, in Waltham, and a short stint in the diocese of Springfield, MA. That was followed by assignments in Lakeville, MA, and Pepperell, MA.

I then returned to the missions, to Paria, Bolivia, the oldest parish in that country, whose history went back to the 1500s. It was high altitude "altiplano" populated mostly by Quechua speaking indigenous people.

After a Sabbatical year in Rome, including time with the Jesuits in Cambridge, I returned to Huarmey, Peru which was coupled with Malvas Peru. Later I worked in Santa Cruz in Bolivia.

The missionary "goes where he is sent" trusting that his superiors understand his talents. My ability in the Quechua language led me to some of the most isolated parts of Peru and Bolivia. They were wonderful years with wonderful people.

In the year 2002 I needed to come home to Boston to be part of the care giving team for my mother who had recently left her "only" home in Lynn. That enabled me to be assigned to Winthrop for a couple years. After my mother's death I took the assignment of pastor at St. Ann's in Peabody.

Now I am here...with more stories than any of you can imagine. Mostly, I'm here at the invitation of Fr. Tim who hopefully knows something of my talents, and would like those talents to benefit the collaborative. Believe me, I am 75 years old, although the face may be deceiving. I'm not as quick as I used to be; but I usually get to where I am going. (For your benefit, *getting* to the END of the sermon.) Bye for now. Father Stanley.

Immaculate Conception School

Making real life connections is important for students when learning a difficult concept. That was the focus of a recent assignment in grade 6 math class. The students were calculating perimeter and area. To bring the lesson to life, the class measured the perimeter of the



outdoor spaces on the school and parish campus. By using a walking measuring tape, which is used by surveyors and engineers, the students measured the property to record their findings. The measurements helped students find the perimeter and area of the spaces. The new protocols that the school follows due to coronavirus requires use of outdoor spaces on a daily basis for mask breaks. The constant focus of remaining 6' apart has us thinking about distance and space on a new level. The math students at the IC are gaining an understanding of how to apply math concepts to their own lives.


