### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

It was a rookie mistake, a moment when I had that sinking feeling of "I should have known better." Despite the warning signs at the entrance pathway urging appropriate footwear, I walked up over the dunes and onto



scalding-hot sands of the beach barefoot. I had done this hundreds of times before without any serious injury. Yeh, the sand could be hot, and yeh, if you stayed in one spot near the dunes it could be very hot. But I always moved quickly towards the water and the cooler sand and had always been able to endure a few yards of hell to get to paradise. "Why would this day be any different," I thought? Well, for one, the beach was greatly enlarged by an extraordinarily low low-tide. The water, it seemed, was half a mile away. And it was June-with the sun directly overhead. . .that old summer-solstice thing. And it was in the mid-90's already. So, I ended up with first degree burns on the soles of my feet that fateful beach day. Twice, actually-once on the way to the water, and again on the way back. A painful lesson-learned: "Read the signs. Follow their directions!" (Yah dummy!) At every stage in life, the Lord teacheth humility, I guess.

The ancient peoples knew what burning sands were all about. Surrounded by desert, the scorching heat and blistering furnace of an arid climate seldom let them forget how unforgiving the wastelands could be. Wander off without proper clothing, water, and food and it was an almost certain death sentence. With unbroken winds churned up, the desert could even encroach on unlucky villages and towns threatening to swallow them up with a blast of sand and heat.

It is this parching imagery that Isaiah used to remind the people of his time and ours that God can and will turn the most-dire of circumstances into the plushest of blessings. What greater turn-around than to have those fiery desert sands transformed into cooling and refreshing pools of water? If images of tropical beaches from the Caribbean and Hawaii come to mind, you are not too far off. With all of the heat and sultry weather we've been having this summer, which one of us hasn't at least considered a jaunt into the ocean, lake or a nearby pool? I know I did! (Humbly clad with sandals, this time!)

That instant quenching of going from hot and miserable to cool and refreshed is a great sign of God's saving action. It is transformative, immediate, and complete. What a dramatic turnaround when you immerse yourself into gentle cooling water on a hot summer day! While a nice cool breeze can bring some relief, water is many times more

His restoration of the hearing and speech of a deaf and mute man in today's Gospel is a sign that God's Kingdom is being unfolded in our midst. Therefore we must turn our eyes to the Lord and seek His loving presence always. As the Psalmist once cried out, "O God, you are my God— it is you I seek! For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, In a land parched, lifeless, and without water." (Ps 63:2)

Like people driven to seek the cooling waters and refreshment we long for on a stifling hot day or blistering beach, may our souls long-for and passionately seek-after the true relief that can only be found in a right-relationship with our Creator. May our prayer this day help accomplish precisely that!

### Holy Communion in the Hand

One COVID-related restriction we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to *receive Holy Communion only in the hand*. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.



### IC Haiti Update

Thanks to the generosity of Immaculate Conception parishioners and other IC Haiti supporters, we are once again able to fund the entire budget for the Fr. Marc Piché Elementary School in Puit Chacha for this school year. Our funding will provide for all school supplies, teacher and staff salaries, a hot lunch program, building maintenance, a dental program for the school community, tuition for graduates to attend the closest secondary school, and all other school-related costs.

We were also hoping to help Saint Boniface Hospital in Fond des Blancs as many people who were physically injured by the August earthquake have been transferred there. Hospitals closer to the epicenter



have either been badly damaged or are now inundated with patients. Saint Boniface is setting up additional emergency operating rooms to deal with the constant flow of people needing surgery.



St. Boniface Hospital is run by Health Equity International, our partner in Haiti. This is why we (IC Haiti) would like to help to defray the cost for the construction and equipping of the additional operating rooms. If you would like to help in this endeavor, please
