Dear Parishioners,

This week we joyfully welcomed Fr. Charley Stanley to join us in living at the IC Rectory in Newburyport. Fr. Stanley is retiring from being Pastor at St. Ann's Church in Peabody as well as many active years in ministry within the



Archdiocese of Boston. Like Fr. Broderick before him, he also was involved in the St. James Missionary Society in South America. Hopefully we will have a few words of introduction and a good picture of Fr. Stanley to share with you in the weeks ahead. In the meantime, if you see him wandering around the streets of Newburyport and beyond, please give him a warm welcome.

This past weekend, I celebrated the first Mass at Nativity Church in Merrimac in almost 6 months. During the pandemic shutdown, we began some long-anticipated work of painting and refinishing the flooring in the church. It was a joy to gather for Mass in a beautifully refreshed space! Because the renovations included adding more hard flooring, the acoustics of the building have greatly improved, so the music truly soars and fills the space!



Congratulations to all who helped contribute to our recent Capital Campaign that helped make this happen. On Monday of this week, work will begin on repairing the steeple at Nativity, also part of the scope of the Capital Campaign projects for Holy Redeemer Parish.

As we open up more of our churches and add Masses to our schedule, we are continuing to look for volunteers who can help with greeting and seating parishioners, serving as Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and cleaners to disinfect the church after each Mass. Our ability to offer even more services is contingent on the number of volunteers who sign-up to help. If enough people make themselves available, we hope to begin offering some Daily Masses soon. If you are able to help either on a weekend, weekday or both, please contact Sheila Cruise in our Collaborative Office. We would love to have you join our volunteer teams.

This week, Immaculate Conception School opened its doors for the first time since the spring to welcome back our student body for in-person classroom learning. Additionally, some families were opting to start the year with remotelearning on their computers and still others were embracing a hybrid approach of both in-person and remote learning. Although many school systems around the country have put forth a one-size-fits-all approach to the fall semester, IC School is doing its best to be flexible and tailor our programs to meet each family's needs. Even though our total capacity is reduced this year due to the needs of social-distancing under COVID-19, we still have a few openings in certain grades and have waiting lists in others. Since last fall the Collaborative Pastoral Council has been meeting and getting itself organized. Now we are about to begin the formal process of selecting and appointing members for distinct terms. At least for the upcoming year we will be meeting virtually.

It is hard to believe that so many months have gone by since we first began the live-stream Masses at HRIC and the pandemic continues to keep us cautious about Mass attendance, wearing masks, social distancing, and hand washing.

The Pastoral Council has continued to meet bi-monthly to closely monitor the situation and to look for additional ways to stay connected and enrich the spiritual lives of everyone in our faith community. We were pleased to return to the 11:30 a.m. Mass at Immaculate Conception and the 9:30 a.m. Mass at St. Ann. Last weekend we began the 4:00 p.m. Mass at IC and 8:00 a.m. Mass in the newly renovated Nativity Church. The live stream Mass continues every Saturday at 4:00 p.m. as well. As Father George says, "It is good for us to be together!"

We are grateful to the many volunteers who assist with organizing, greeting and seating, cleaning the churches, and the scheduling of Extraordinary Ministers and lectors. It is not an easy task and we are blessed to have so many willing to commit to welcoming everyone and ensuring our safety. We hope to add more Sunday Masses to the schedule and to commence daily Mass later in the fall. We are also exploring the possibility of Eucharistic Adoration and a Vespers service. Again, all is dependent upon the availability of volunteers.

Other initiatives discussed and launched are the Word on Fire/Engage program which has been highlighted on the website and in the bulletin (see page 4). This program offers a wealth of information, videos, and reflections designed to educate and inspire as we learn more about the history and beauty of our Catholic faith.

As you will note in the first column of this page, the Pastoral Council is seeking additional members and would appreciate your input and nominations of potential candidates from both Immaculate Conception and Holy Redeemer. The Council's role is to serve in an advisory capacity to the Pastor and, during this pandemic and the ever changing landscape around Mass attendance, the advice and service of this group has been invaluable.

We are also determining how best to include all interested parishioners in the monthly Pastoral Council meetings while we continue to engage virtually. Stay tuned for further information. As always, your interest and input are most welcome.

May God continue to bless you and your loved ones as we pray for a conclusion to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Zooming in on Faith

On Line with Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is rooted in Jesus' teaching on prayer. "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer, we enter our private room where God is always waiting with love.

The Old Testament too, affirms the way of silent prayer. In Psalm 46:10 we hear, "Be still and know that I am God." This ancient Christian prayer of silence was practiced by the Desert Fathers and Mothers and those in monastic life. They sought an intimate relationship with God through a contemplative path of silent communion that is deeper than communication with words.

Responding to a desire among Christian seekers for a more contemplative path, Frs. Thomas Keating, Basil Pennington, and William Meninger, Trappist monks at St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer, Massachusetts created a simple but powerful way for people from every walk of life to be in communion with God who dwells within us, They chose the name Centering Prayer for this practice that provides an opportunity to enter one's private room, abandon attachment to thought, leave the noise of the world behind and with an open heart, surrender with faith and rest silently in God's unconditional love.

Centering Prayer is a practice and a discipline. One to two daily periods of letting go of all thoughts during silent prayer fosters self-emptying. As God fills this space, He shifts our focus from self to God. Practitioners are also encouraged to attend weekly group Centering Prayer sessions that provide support, education, and the blessings of a community. As God becomes the center of our life through faithfulness to the practice, life's vicissitudes and storms affect us less. Living out of God as our Center we experience the peace the world cannot give. Silently resting in God, we assent to the Holy Spirit's presence and action in our lives. This act of faith and surrender opens hearts and minds to God. As we continue to pray, the Holy Spirit moves in the activities and interactions of our daily lives and within us. Over time as we respond to the Spirit's work in us, we are transformed.

Commissioned bν the Contemplative Outreach organization, Elizabeth McCarthy began the Centering Prayer group at Immaculate Conception in 2013 and serves as facilitator. Since then the group has met weekly on Wednesday evening from 6-7 p.m. at the HRIC Pastoral Center. Centering Prayer groups are usually small and weekly attendance at HRIC varies from 6-12. Total group membership is approximately 20. Group meetings begin with 30 minutes of Centering Prayer. Silently resting in God and surrendering and assenting to God's presence and action opens minds and hearts to hear God's words read from Sacred Scripture in group Lectio Divina that follows.

For the next 30 minutes members listen to God's words through four readings of a scripture passage. After each reading, they ponder and share: what words have come to their attention, what they experience the Lord saying to

them here and now, and how God's personal message might guide choices and actions.

Since March, 8–10 members have met via Zoom as a result of the COVID-19 restrictions. The weekly meeting format remains the same. Praying and sharing in one's personal space but remaining in community via the Internet has allowed this group to continue its prayerful reflection, so necessary during these uncertain times.

If you are looking for a quiet, safe place to pray and reflect, a way to find the peace the world cannot give, ease the anxieties brought on by the continuance of the COVID-19 pandemic, are in recovery or a 12-step program, or if you are interested simply in engaging in a new path to continue your spiritual journey, all are welcome. Prayer to Overcome Racism


Mary, friend and mother to all, through your Son, God has found a way to unite himself to every human being, called to be one people, sisters and brothers to each other.




