The reason that the Sunday celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a holy day of obligation is due to the fact that Jesus rose from the dead on Sunday—the first day of the week. The fact that Jesus rose from the dead on Sunday is a detail that is filled with meaning.

Sunday is the first day of the week. This coincides with the first day of creation. Thus, the resurrection occurred on the same day when the very thing that was to be redeemed was begun—creation itself (and we are a part of creation).

However, Sunday is not only the first day of the week. It not only marks the beginning of creation. Sunday is also the eighth day—the day after the seventh day. It is the day beyond creation. It is the day of the new creation. In the Book of Genesis all things are portrayed as having been created in six days and on the seventh day God rested. The entire act of creation—including God's rest—is a complete and perfect act. Hence, the reason why seven is symbolic of perfection and wholeness.

Sunday is the eighth day—the day of re-creation. It is the day of the new creation. This is why the Christian Sabbath is on Sunday and not on Saturday. Sunday is always a day of solemnity and festival because of the resurrection of Jesus. Sunday is the primordial feast day of the Church year. Every other part of sacred time (the Church year) flows from it.
