The late Archbishop John L. May of St. Louis told this tale:

A drunk staggered on a bus and slumped into a seat right next to a priest who had just been appointed a bishop. Through bleary eyes, the man gazed at the priest in his Roman collar and asked: "Are you a priest?"

The newly appointed bishop replied with resignation: "I was a priest."

His new traveling companion whispered his concern for all to hear: "Was it drink that done it?"

On St. Patrick's Day, an Irishman was asked,

"Why are Irish jokes so simple?"

"So the English can understand them," he replied.

This last week on Thursday the first reading at daily Mass was from The Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 8, Verses 26-40. This is the account of St. Philip meeting up with an Ethiopian eunuch who was returning home after worshipping in Jerusalem. The following is the passage:

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south... And behold, an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a minister of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of all her treasure, had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go up and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet, and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless some one guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. Now the passage of the scripture which he was reading was this:

"As a sheep led to the slaughter or a lamb before its shearer is dumb, so he opens not his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken up from the earth."

And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, pray, does the prophet say this, about himself or about some one else?" Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this scripture he told him the good news of Jesus. And as they went along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What is to prevent my being baptized?" And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught up Philip; and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. (Acts 8:26-40)

The Ethiopia referred to here is actually the Kingdom of Nubia. This kingdom was located south of Egypt and above Aswan where the first waterfall on the River Nile is. It is now part of what is currently Sudan. Candace is not a proper name but is the dynastic title of the queens that ruled the kingdom. At that time the kingdom was in fact ruled by women. This man would have held a high office. He may have been a Jew, a member of another race and had become Jewish, or a pagan who feared God. But he was well disposed towards the Jewish religion.

Philip meets up with him and he is so open to faith that he invites Philip to sit with him. The man is reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and is in fact reading a passage that directly refers to Jesus. The Eunuch invites Philip to explain to him its meaning. So Philip explains to him that it refers to Jesus and proclaims the gospel message to him. And upon hearing it and accepting it the eunuch asks Philip to baptize him.

The passage tells us that when Philip departed the eunuch went on his way rejoicing. What do you suppose happened to the eunuch? What kind of reception did he get when he got back home? Some people probably thought he had lost it. Some probably were unwilling to hear what he had to share with them. But others probably saw the great joy he now had, joy that comes from Jesus and the Holy Spirit, and desired it for themselves. Indeed, he went on his way rejoicing. Like the Ethiopian eunuch did after he learned of Jesus and was baptized, do we go on our way rejoicing? Do we have joy with us when we go along the way and do we bring it to others?
