Pastor's Corner

In these last few weeks before the national elections I find that emotions are running higher than ever.

I've also noticed more overzealous talk about how a Catholic ought to vote. I am happy that Bishop Clark, our regional bishop in the Our Lady of the Angels Pastoral Region has produced for us a synthesis of Catholic theology and doctrine regarding faithful citizenship and elections. I think you will find his objective summary very helpful.

A Statement from Bishop Edward Clark, Regional Bishop in Los Angeles Concerning the National Elections and a Call to Faithful Citizenship

In just a few weeks, the Nation will complete the voting process. I am taking this opportunity to respond to some inquiries I have received from Church members in recent weeks.

First, the Church does not support or oppose any candidates running for office.

Second, where the Church takes a position on particular legislation, that position is based on issues of morality and not of politics. In casting your vote, consider the moral implications of the proposition

Third, there is no "Catholic party." No political party fully agrees with all the moral positions of the Church. If anyone, even a bishop or a priest, should tell you that as a Catholic you cannot vote for a particular party or that you must vote for one party rather than the other, know that the Church does not endorse such a position. Vote the party of your choice.

Fourth, the Catholic Church is not a one issue church. There are a great many moral and ethical concerns the Church is called to address. It is a danger to consider only one issue to the detriment of all others.

Fifth, as Catholics, we are called to vote for the common good (in other words, to vote for what is the greatest good for the greatest number of people) and to vote from our conscience (not from political, social or financial convenience).

Finally, the Church encourages each one of us to register and vote – it is the responsible and Catholic thing to do. We are all called to be faithful citizens.

Sunday School

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them? Would you like them to be familiar with favorite Old and New Testament bible stories? Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable just talking to God in their own words? Do you wish there was a way for a preschool aged child to understand the message in the gospel reading?

The answer to your questions is Sunday School! Our Sunday School program helps the 3, 4, 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year old child build a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the gifts He has given us. Our developmentally appropriate lessons are based on the gospel stories for each week. Sunday school begins October 4th and continues to May 2nd. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and 3 years old by Sept. 1st.

For the 20-21 school year, we will be offering Sunday School virtually. Lesson content, activity pages and a link for a virtual lesson with a teacher and additional resources will be emailed to enrolled families. In the event we are able to offer traditional classes during mass at some point during the year, families will be given the option to attend in person or continue to receive lessons virtually.

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: The catechism, in the section called Profession of Faith, describes the workings of "Theophanies and the Law." What are they, and how do these divine aspects of Catholicism serve to illuminate and bear witness to a part of the mystery of faith?

A: The catechism readings describe theophanies as, "manifestations of God, lighting the way of promise." God gave his law and his promise as gifts. The theophanies allowed God to be "seen and heard", as in the cloud of the Holy Spirit at the time of Moses and from the time of Joshua, the visions that "inaugurated the missions of the great prophets." Our wonderful Choir sings about the Illuminative law and the theophanies found in scripture, here based on Psalm 27:

"The Lord is my light and my salvation.

If God is my help, whom should I fear?

I shall see for myself the grace of God..."






