

"My batteries are still running," says Sister Florence Kruczek (right), 91. "I get up each morning and say, 'O Lord, thank you for the gift of another day." Sister Florence and Sister de Lourdes Okoniewski, 87, are members of the Bernardine Franciscans of Reading, Pennsylvania. Each entered religious life in the 1940s, fresh out of high school. In addition to serving in Catholic schools, Sister Florence obtained a doctorate in French and taught for 25 years at Alvernia University, an institution founded by her congregation. Sister de Lourdes spent 43 years in Catholic education and then Help for Those Who Have Given a Lifetime pursued various other ministries, finally "retiring" at age 85. Today, both sisters focus their energies on praying for the needs of the Church and world. Gifts to the Retirement Fund for Religious help the Bernardine Franciscans-and hundreds of communities of women and men religious-provide for the ongoing needs of aging members. A portion of the proceeds also underwrites resources on retirement planning and eldercare delivery. Almost 94 percent of donations directly aid senior religious and their communities.

Happy New Year! Happy New Year? Yes, it is the beginning of our new liturgical year with the celebration of the lighting of our Advent Candle. The Advent Season is not only for the preparation of the Christmas Season, but it is the changing of the liturgical calendar the Church uses to replace the cycle of readings utilized in the welcoming of Jesus Christ, our newborn King. Starting this First Sunday of Advent, the Church will be proclaiming from the Gospel of St. Matthew.

St. Matthew's Gospel begins our Advent by telling us to "Stay Awake." We are, through our baptism, called for remaining vigilant in the coming of our Lord. In the Rite of Baptism, when the parents and godparents receive the light of Christ from the celebrant, the closing of that prayer states: "When the Lord comes, may he or she go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom."

We, as a family baptized in the name of Jesus, are called to live out a life imitating Jesus and his ways in words and in deeds. While at the same time, we are vigilant in Jesus' return. Waiting for Jesus to come back causes us to practice the virtue of patience and the gift of perseverance. Yet, what a gift we are able to practice in anticipation of Christ coming to us. We can practice the works of mercy for Christ and his people. The practice of these works of mercy, is not just giving back to God, but to those made in His image and likeness as well.

Advent is a time of change. The changes can be a Church calendar, a change in the sacred scripture cycle, a change in how we live our lives, and a change in how we wait for the coming of our Lord and King. My hope for the parish is that we experience a change in our lives in which we remain vigilant for Jesus' coming, while doing good for one another. Please do something for the arrival of Our King of Kings, for those we call neighbor, and most of all, do something for your soul.

Next weekend, will you be ready for the arrival of our Capuchin guests and their On the Rise Bakery products? I know I am! We will hear about their ministry before Mass, and after Mass, their products will be sold in the school hallway.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception - Monday December 9 - 8:30 am Mass

On **Monday, December 9th**, this year our Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the solemn dogma defined by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854. Our Lady Immaculately Conceived is the patroness of the United States of America. This year, it is not a holy day of obligation in the United States.

Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." — Catechism of the Catholic Church

O God, who by the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin prepared a worthy dwelling for your Son, grant, we pray, that, as you preserved her from every stain by virtue of the Death of your Son, which you foresaw, so, through her intercession, we, too, may be cleansed and admitted to your presence. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.


REMINDER ... On The Rise Bakery Coming Next Weekend!!
