FR. ED'S CORNER

First Sunday of Advent "Let us go rejoicing to the House of the Lord!"

The prophet Isaiah, concerned as always with what would best serve the People of God, gives his explanation of why we should go up to His House. It is so that He may "instruct us in His ways, and we may walk in His paths." David has given us ample explanation of what our frame of mind should be as we go to His House: "Let us go rejoicing!" Why should we rejoice? This whole season of Advent is about rejoicing, because we know that what we most long for, a deeper relationship with the Person of Jesus, the fulfillment of all our desires, is what this season is all about. Even though many of the Scriptures of this season, like today's, focus on the climactic events of the Second Coming, we know that the grace of this season is not simply about persevering until He returns. Its primary focus is on preparing our hearts so that the reality of His first coming may be more deeply present to us. This is so that we don't simply commemorate His birth in Bethlehem; we experience His birth more deeply in us. As the Fathers of the Church have commented, this season focuses on what some of them term His third coming: His being born more deeply in each one of us.

We prepare ourselves for that by going to His House precisely so that, as David pointed out, He may instruct us in His ways. How does He do that? Primarily through His Word, in which He Who is the Word of God speaks to us! The first reading and the Gospel both share with us why this is important. Our actions, our lives, have consequences, and to the extent that we know His ways and walk in them, then we can experience His care, His love, His protection. But that knowledge is not neutral, because there is an alternative if we don't walk in His ways. As the Gospel points out, there is a real chance that we could be left, left behind. As the Gospel also points out, we do not know the time. It might be that the mysterious events that the Gospel literally describes may happen in our time, one being taken, one being left. But whether or not they do, it will surely be the case that each one of us will stand before Him as our judge and we shall hear Him say either, "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Master," or the horrifying alternative: "Depart from Me into the everlasting fire...." This is why we just heard Paul plead with the Romans to "throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." He has great desire that those he ministers to and evangelizes would be the ones who enter into His joy, so he pleads with them, exhorting them to make the choices that will bring that about.

The Church chooses Gospel passages during this season of Advent that highlight the role of St. John the Baptist. He is not a figure involved in the infancy narratives that mark the beginning of the first coming (except for the Visitation, of course). Rather, he is involved in the events surrounding the beginning of the Lord Jesus' public ministry, decades after the Bethlehem event. Why does the Church use this time to remind us of St. John the Baptist's ministry? Because he calls us to repent and believe, and nothing better prepares our hearts for a deeper union with the Lord Jesus than turning away from those things that rob us of that union.

The grace that rests on this season is a grace of deeper union with the Lord Jesus. That deeper union is accomplished by us responding to His invitation of grace and turning toward Him and away from what robs us of His presence—we put on the armor of light and throw off the works of darkness. We especially spend extra time in His Word, because it is the only way we will have the knowledge we need to walk in His paths! As He sends us the Holy Spirit to show us where we are on the wrong path, we repent and follow Him. Even so, come, Lord Jesus, come! — Fr. Ed Fride





First Saturday Mass and Prayer for Vocations, Evangelization, and in Reparation for Blasphemies against Our Lady's Immaculate Heart:

Baptisms: Baptismal Catechesis is a Diocesan requirement (you only have to attend the class once). Next class: Jan. 20, 2020. You don't need to wait to have your baby before attending the class. Baptisms normally occur on the second Sunday of the month. To schedule your child's Baptism and/or to register for Baptismal catechesis, please contact Mark Zielman (mzielman@ctkcc.net or 734-929-0973). If attending the catechesis, please read the section on Baptism in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Couples planning on getting married through Christ the King must contact Dcn. Lou at dcnlou@ctkcc.net for an appointment. Please note that the wedding date cannot be set until that initial meeting and must take into account a one-year period of preparation. Due to the fact that we are a personal parish, we are allowed to offer the Sacrament of Matrimony only to our registered parishioners (that is, the bride, groom, or one of the parents must be a registered parishioner). Thank you for your understanding. Questions? Please contact Dcn. Lou.

Confessions: Friday 5:00 - 5:25pm & Saturday after 9am Mass until all Confessions are heard. Confessions are also offered beginning 30 minutes before Saturday 4:30pm Mass, Sunday morning Masses, and Holy Day Masses. It is preferred that devotional Confessions (not confessing mortal sins) be made on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Confessions will end 5 minutes before the scheduled start time for Mass.

Bulletin Announcements, Pulpit Announcements, Brochures, and Fliers: All of the above must be submitted to the Parish Office in writing no later than noon on Monday in order to be published that weekend. There are early deadlines before holidays and occasionally for other reasons, so please plan accordingly.

Bulletin announcements go to bulletin@ctkcc.net or a copy of the announcement may be faxed to 734-663-3735, dropped off, or sent by US Mail. Submissions are prioritized based on specific criteria and space available. Submission alone does not guarantee it will be printed.

To announce a specific event, the event must be taking place during the weekend of the announcement. To announce registration for an upcoming event, a representative of the group requesting the announcement must be available on the day of the announcement in the St. John Paul the Great Room. Anything not meeting those criteria should be submitted to the bulletin editor for consideration. No brochures or fliers will be posted or distributed without approval by Fr. Ed. No exceptions!

When a death occurs at a time when normal communication channels will not allow the parish office to process the information in a timely way (e.g. after business hours on Friday) and you would like the deceased included in the Prayers of the Faithful that weekend, please let Fr. Ed or a deacon know in person before the weekend Mass you are attending.
