MISSION STATEMENT

St. George Parish in Waimanalo is a Community of many diverse people joined together to proclaim God's Word in Holy Scripture by celebrating the Liturgy and building a Faith Community. Uniquely embraced by the majestic Koolau and rolling seas we strive to be a Welcoming Parish and commit ourselves to serve the people of God through Outreach, Unity and Renewal.

The message of the gospel is simple enough to be available to all people. God loves us. He sent His Son to save us. His Son continues His work of teaching and sanctifying in His Church. Let us pray that we shall not add nor subtract from the truth of Jesus Christ, and that we shall live the simplicity of our faith.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4: 1-2, 6-8 -In today's first reading Moses warned the Israelites not to add to or subtract from word. But God's in later times interpretations of the Torah became as important as the Torah itself.

Second Reading: James 1: 17-18, 21b-22, 27 - All good things come from God. If we receive blessings from God, He expects us to show forth His goodness in our lives. Religion is shown by our deeds and not by our words.

Gospel: Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23 - The Pharisees had the reputation for being the most religious and holy and virtuous people. But Jesus calls them hypocrites who follow their own way and not the way of God.

Today's Reflection: Our Legacy of Faith



The Old Testament tells of a golden calf, produced by the Israelites when Moses disappeared up the mountain to receive God's law (see Exodus 32). Since Moses delayed, they melted gold brought from Egypt, made their own god, and began worshiping it. This is the essence of idolatry: We create a god to worship, but since it is our creation, we are really worshiping ourselves. Jesus accused the Pharisees of falling into a similar trap. They slavishly revered human traditions that didn't reflect the heart of God. They hid behind laws created in the name of religion to serve themselves and their desire for power. Jesus tables of their self-intriffactions. He guestes the graph of a graph of their self-intriffactions.

overturns the tables of their self-justifications. He quotes the prophet as an accusation: "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me" (Mark 7:6). Before pointing an accusatory finger, realize that the same can happen to us. We can cling to human traditions and laws while disregarding God's basic commands of love and mercy. We can hide behind those laws and traditions to justify our self-righteousness and look down on others who are not as pious as us, as noted by James: "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (James 1:22). Pope Francis makes a special effort to remind the Church, especially the clergy, of this truth: "Dangerous as it was then for the Pharisees, so too is it for us to consider ourselves acceptable, or even worse, better than others simply for observing the rules...even though we do not love our neighbor, we are hard of heart, we are arrogant and proud." + By Fr.
