MISSION STATEMENT

St. George Parish in Waimanalo is a Community of many diverse people joined together to proclaim God's Word in Holy Scripture by celebrating the Liturgy and building a Faith Community. Uniquely embraced by the majestic Koolau and rolling seas we strive to be a Welcoming Parish and commit ourselves to serve the people of God through Outreach, Unity and Renewal.

The vineyard is the kingdom of God. The tenant farmers refused to give the owner of the vineyard his share of the vintage. The conclusion of the story is that the vineyard is to be given to others. Unless we bring forth good fruit in righteous living, we shall lose the kingdom of God. Let us ray that we shall show in our deeds the faith we profess with our lips.

TODAY'S READINGS

1st Reading: Isaiah 5: 1-7 - The Bible uses many metaphors to describe God's relationship with His people. The metaphor used in today's first reading is that of a vineyard. The Lord plants a vineyard and hires it out to tenant farmers. But He expects a return on His investment.

2nd Reading: Philippians 4: 6-9 - Our faith is proved by our deeds. If we have been blessed by God, then we must live lives which are more virtuous than any merely human goodness. In today's second reading St. Paul instructs us to live the life of Christ in our own lives.

Must register for classes which are Gospel: Matthew 21: 33-43 - Jesus uses the selection from Isaiah which was our first reading today. God has planted a vineyard and rented it. He expects a return and an increase. When there is none, He rejects the tenants and gives His vineyard to others. If we fail to live up to our faith, we shall lose it.

Gospel Reflection: Matthew 21:33-43



Rejection is one of the most important experiences of our lives. We can respond to rejection by hating and rejecting others. We can spend our lives trying to show those who have rejected us how big a mistake they've made. We can fall into the trap of centering our lives on being rejected.

On the other hand, we can refuse to deal with rejection ourselves. We can cast it on the Lord (1 Pt 5:7). He is the most rejected Person ever, but He will in no way reject us (Jn 6:37). He doesn't get caught up in reacting to rejection. He is caught up in loving everyone, even enemies who reject Him. If we take our rejection to Jesus, we'll be caught up in love. This will lead to a life of true greatness. Joseph, for example, was

rejected by his brothers (Gn 37:4ff). However, he didn't build his life a round being rejected, but focused on doing God's will, and became one of the greatest men in history.

What we do with rejection will make or break us. Let's fix our eyes on Jesus (Heb 12:2), not rejection. Let Jesus be the Lord of your rejection. He will turn rejection to the good for those who love Him (Rm 8:28).


