MISSION STATEMENT

St. George Parish in Waimanalo is a Community of many diverse people joined together to proclaim God's Word in Holy Scripture by celebrating the Liturgy and building a Faith Community. Uniquely embraced by the majestic Koolau and rolling seas we strive to be a Welcoming Parish and commit ourselves to serve the people of God through Outreach, Unity and Renewal.

Imagine the most delicious dinner you've ever had in your life. Imagine the happiest experience of your entire life. These things are absolutely nothing when compared to the eternal joy of our heavenly banquet with the Lord. The Lord invites all peoples to salvation; let us accept His invitation and enter into His eternal joy.

TODAY'S READINGS

1st Reading: Isaiah 25: 6-10a - Authentic Jewish tradition believed that someday God would invite the Gentiles -- the non-Jews -to share in salvation. God would invite all nations to share in the great feast of joy. Today's first reading reflects this hope for universal salvation.

2nd Reading: Philippians 4: 12-14, 19-20 -St. Paul was in jail when he wrote today's reading. The Philippian people had been kind to him when others had abandoned him. In spite of his own difficulties, Paul expresses hope to them: he has learned to cope. He is confident that God will always be with us and supply for our needs.

Gospel: Matthew 22: 1-14 - The gospel today is the parable of the great feast. As we listen to the words of this familiar parable, let us reflect how sad it is to turn one's back on God's invitation to grace. Let us pray that we shall always respond to God's invitation Pastor at least six months prior to wedding to His banquet of salvation, and let us resolve that we shall daily convert our lives to His ways.

Today's Reflection: We're the Supporting Cast

Life can make us think we are in control of our lives. We plan, think, execute, and succeed (or fail). Then along comes an illness, an accident, a job loss, or one of countless other things, and we realize we really aren't in control of much. This famous phrase sums it up: Man proposes, God disposes. We can transfer this same false assumption into our relationship with God and expect Mass, prayer, and liturgy to work for us, fill us, and entertain us. But liturgy and prayer are about giving God his glory above all else. When we pray, and especially when we enter into communal liturgy, we are reminded once again that it is all about what God is doing. Isaiah says the Lord will provide for all people. God will provide! We might prepare, serve, or participate, but the director, producer, and main actor is God. We are the supporting cast. That is why liturgy is not so much about our planning, participation, or entertainment but about entering into harmony with God's action and praising him as he asks. The same point can be found in the Gospel. The king sends out invitations for his son's wedding and prepares the feast. He adjusts to the unexpected lack of interest and invites others. The ones who arrive are the ones the master has invited. It would be foolish for one of the invited guests to promote their importance. Their role is to humbly enjoy and gracefully help the king and the newlyweds to shine on their night! + ~ Fr. Mark Haydu, LC



Reflections from the Word of God to Prepare for the 2020 Elections

As faithful citizens of the United States, the State of Hawaii, and the local regions to which we belong, we not only enjoy the right to vote, but we have a civic duty to do so to make our democracy a government "of the people, by the people, and for the people." The following are offered as an invitation to prayer and discernment about some of the issues facing our community to help all discern God's will regarding the persons we elect for public office. We urge you to pray over them in this time leading up to our November 3 elections.

One Nation under God - Religious Liberty

Our nation was founded on "the laws of nature and nature's God." Do we still share this fundamental belief? For those who do believe, is that belief fostered or threatened by our culture and its leaders? "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength." (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)

The Sanctity of Life from Conception until Natural Death

Pope Francis has said that without the right to life, no other right has meaning. What can we do to halt and reverse the hidden Holocaust of abortion that is so accepted that it is protected by law? How can we assure that our leaders will work for a greater respect for life in all its stages, including the lives of convicted criminals, of the frail elderly, of the poor, and of other vulnerable persons?
