MISSION STATEMENT

The biblical concept of faith is "steadfast loyalty." Faith means we are trustworthy and conscientious toward God and that we are loyal to Him, no matter what. If we have this kind of biblical faith, we shall not allow the troubles of the world to overcome us. Let us pray for this kind of faith.

TODAY'S READINGS:

1st Reading: Habakkuk 1: 2-3; 2: 2-4 - Habakkuk wondered why God's chosen people should suffer from the wicked. True, God's people were wicked; they had sinned. But why should the all-good God use the wicked to punish them? God seemed unjust. But the answer is that God permits evil only for a good purpose but never wills evil. Through all, the person of faith will conquer.

2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 1: 6-8, 13-14 - A disciple can get discouraged when tragedies strike his teacher. Paul baptized Timothy, ordained him a priest and even calls Timothy his dear son in the Lord. But when Paul was imprisoned, Timothy's faith weakened. Paul exhorts Timothy – and us – to be strong in the faith, no matter what hardships come our way.

Gospel: Luke 17: 5-10 - A mustard seed is very small. Yet today, Jesus tells us that if we have faith the size of a mustard seed, we could move mountains. We are weak, unprofitable servants; but the Lord is powerful. Let us renew our faith in His strength.

Today's Reflection: Kindling the Faith



I have a little jar of mustard seeds on the bookcase in my office. They were given to me as a going-away present by a priest I knew, a little reminder to keep the faith. Every time I hear the Gospel about the mustard seed, I am reminded of him. He was a mentor and friend, one of the many people who have inspired my faith from young adulthood until now. He is also the example of what I hope to be for the students I teach. The faith that we explore is a rich inheritance, indeed, and I can only hope to influence my students as much as he

influenced me. Being a faith-filled person isn't for cowards. As Paul tells Timothy, God gave us gifts of power and love to be able to stand against evil and to love those who seem unlovable. God called us to a holy life, which means that we occasionally have to turn away from what the world has to offer and embrace a different way of living. Christ's disciples are called to help make the world holy through word and example, by inviting others to know Christ and acting in such a way that knowing Christ seems the only possible response. Finally, God gave us the Holy Spirit, who makes it possible for us to live lives that are worthy of the calling to which we have been called. "Stir into flame the gift of God," Paul exhorts (2 Timothy 1:6). Fire is the perfect metaphor. It lights our way and gives us warmth. It also purifies us for the work ahead. Who inspired you in your faith? How will you become a better disciple today because of them? +Mary Katharine Deelev

"Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life"

Today the gift of life is threatened in countless ways. Those who are most vulnerable, rather than receiving the protection they deserve, are all too often seen as a burden and as expendable. As new attacks on human life continue to emerge, we can be tempted to despair, but Christ instead offers us unfailing hope.

Hope is not false optimism or empty positivity. Christian hope is something much more profound and goes to the very depths of our identity as followers of Christ. Hope is the virtue "by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1817).

Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of a woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his last on the Cross at Calvary in order that He might save us. Therefore, "God is the foundation of hope: not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end"

Christians know "they have a future: it is not that they know the details of what awaits them, but they know in general terms that their life will not end in emptiness" When the seas of life swell and we are battered by the waves, hope allows us to remain anchored in the heart of God. May we hold fast to Christ our hope, from the beginning of life to its very end.
