

# From the Pastor's Desk

This past weekend at each of our three churches you might have noticed a debate brewing in the Sanctuary before Mass began. During the time meant for silent prayer before Mass, there was a quiet argument ensuing.

If you happened to look up what you would have seen was different people gathered around the Advent wreaths explaining the precise order in which the candles on the wreaths are to be lit over the four Sundays of Advent. We all know that the pink candle is saved for the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudate Sunday. But the big question is which purple candle do you light first, and then which purple candle comes next.

The very act of writing this is a dangerous move on my part. On the issue of the great Advent Candle Lighting Order debate – passions run high!

To my estimation there are three main camps in this great Catholic debate. The first group argues passionately that you start with the front candle and move your way around the wreath in a clockwise fashion. The second group insists that you also start in the front of the wreath, but that you must move in a counter clockwise pattern instead. Finally, there are those rebels, those outside the box thinkers who insist you start in the back of the wreath, and rather than progressing clockwise or counterclockwise, you instead jump next to the front of the wreath, before progressing to the pink candle on the third week.

Who is right? The truth is no one, or everyone depending on how you want to word it. For my safety I will go with everyone. There is actually no set order in which to light the Advent Wreath. The only direction the Church gives us is that the pink candle is to be lit for the third week of Advent- besides that we are on our own to light accordingly. When people say "the candles must be lit this way"- what they really mean is they are used to it being lit in one way or another. What people are describing is a habit, custom, or way of doing things they have grown used to.

Sometimes in life we grow used to doing things one particular way or another. We get in a habit and seldom stray far from it. A habit can be a good thing, like saying daily prayers, or exercising. However, it also can be a bad thing, like not saying prayers, or not exercising, or other things like being snippy with others, overeating, or gossiping. One great way to prepare for Christmas during this Advent season is to take aim at habits- add some good ones and work to break some bad ones.

In a real way we have a chance not only to be better people, but most importantly to be better Christians- to live more fully as God intends us too! John the Baptist gives us a great witness in this regard. He focuses on prayer and fasting as a way to prepare the heart. His gaze is always towards Christ, but he does not just look at Jesus: he prepares his heart and life to receive Him.

Here is a crazy idea for us to consider. What if this year instead of making the proverbial Christmas wish list of the things we want, we made a list of the things we want in our lives, the things that God wants in our lives. I am not talking about money, cookies, or anything else. What if we made a list of those parts of how we live that we want God to help us obtain- so that we can better prepare ourselves for His coming-I am thinking of things like patience, temperance, courage, understanding, purity, faith, hope, love, forgiveness, and mercy. Better yet, what if we took serious time to consider how we can best seek these things out and grow.

Advent is a beautiful time to stop, think, pray, and prepare. The best part of preparation is that we are ready for all that comes our way and all that will be. The hardest part of preparation is that it takes hard work. We are tough, hardy, New Englanders- we are not afraid of hard work. This Advent let's do the hard work of getting our spiritual house in order, just as we get our physical homes in order and reflecting the beauty of the season and the beauty of God's love.


