From the Desk Of.... Fr. Kevin Poecking Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



Happy Easter! Christ is risen, Alleluia! Easter always brings with it great promise and a promise of something very special this year. First, it is our hope in the resurrection. The resurrection of Christ brings with it our hope for the resurrection

of our loved ones to eternal life, not to mention for ourselves. Besides the spiritual dimension, Easter always brings with it festive time with family and also chocolates and candy for the younger members of our community. It always arrives with the hope that Spring brings too, with flower blossoms and warmer weather. While the weather we may see on Easter morning this year might be a little cooler that we'd like for mid-April, it's still better than the winter weather of Western Pennsylvania.

This year, Easter brings with it what many of us have been waiting for, for over two years. We are slowly coming out of the darkness of two years of pandemic restrictions. Two years ago, most of us weren't even allowed in church on Easter. Now, it seems that Church attendance is almost back to normal, bursting on Easter! Besides the restrictions, there seemed to be constant arguments over the causes of the pandemic and how to avoid the illness or protect ourselves best. While many of us still mourn the lives of those lost due to COVID, we are no longer living in the same fear that we were one or two years ago. Nevertheless, the fears that it placed on our lives still seem to linger. This lingering sentiment has had some positive effect too, making some more curious about spiritual matters and eternal life.

Over the past few months, I have had several people contact me with similar inquiries. Some have asked about making faith a more important element in their lives and how to go about that. Some have come to confession after two years with a renewed sense of faith, and wanting more to read or learn about their faith. We have four people who are received into the Catholic Church this Easter Vigil, but Ron Donatelli, our RCIA Director, has informed me that more than double that number have inquired recently about next year's RCIA process. That's awesome. In addition to all of that, more and more parishioners are getting involved in our ministries and community activities. It's very exciting

to see our parish come back to a fuller life like we remember from pre-COVID times. It's also nice to see so many people from different former parishes continue to work together in our Holy Family Parish.

If you know someone who is looking to get back to a practice of the faith or wanting to get more involved, the best place to start, both to be inspired in faith, and to meet new people, is the Alpha program that our parish is offering. I am inviting you to join this spring's Alpha program, to bring a friend, especially for those who have joined our parish over the past two years and don't know many of us yet. Alpha will remind everyone who participates how much God loves us and wants for each of us to be part of the Christian life. It's not too late to join the Alpha course beginning this Thursday at St. Januarius Church, but we hope to have another program in the fall.

On behalf of Holy Family Parish, I and our clergy team wish you and your families a most beautiful Easter day of resurrection!

La Experiencia Pascual (segunda parte)

Estas certezas fundamentales de nuestra fe, nos las transmiten los Evangelios pensando en hermanos y hermanas que vivían un tiempo de martirio y crucifixión, intentando fortalecer la esperanza y la resistencia ante la injusticia. Pero llegan también a nosotros hoy, iluminando nuestra propia realidad de crucifixión, fortaleciendo nuestra esperanza y resistencia, y animándonos a seguir a Jesús.

Si Jesucristo no ha resucitado ¿qué Buena Noticia podríamos comunicar? Toda nuestra fe quedaría vacía de sentido. No tendríamos ninguna esperanza verdaderamente definitiva para aportar a la humanidad. Solo la resurrección de Jesús fundamenta y da sentido a nuestras propias cruces, a nuestra fe, misión y lucha por un mañana plenamente humano, feliz y trascendente. El crucificado que ha resucitado es la razón de nuestra esperanza.

La resurrección no es una realidad reservada únicamente para después de la muerte. Si bien la resurrección de Jesús es la garantía de la vida plena después de la muerte, allá, en ese momento, sólo Dios dirá, él será el protagonista. Mientras tanto, en el aquí y en el ahora, los protagonistas somos nosotros, pues la resurrección es garantía y esperanza, pero viviendo como Jesús. Lo importante es vivir ya desde ahora como Jesús muerto y resucitado (Col 3, 1-4; Rom 6, 4-5).

Dios al resucitar a Jesús triunfó sobre la injusticia que le causó la muerte. La utopía de Jesús sigue vigente. La vida plena es posible. La vida vencerá a la muerte, esa es nuestra convicción y el motor de la misión. Jesús también hoy nos dice "... vayan y hagan discípulos a todas las naciones... estaré con ustedes hasta el fin de los tiempos" (Mt 28, 19-20).

2. Reflexión desde la Palabra de Dios y desde Aparecida

a.- La experiencia del Resucitado: Jesucristo, con su muerte y resurrección, inaugura en medio de nosotros el Reino de vida del Padre, que alcanzará su plenitud allí donde no habrá más "muerte, ni luto, ni llanto, ni dolor, porque todo lo antiguo ha desaparecido (Ap 21, 4). El misterio pascual de Jesús es el acto de obediencia y amor al Padre y de entrega por todos sus hermanos, mediante el cual el Mesías dona plenamente aquella vida que ofrecía en caminos y aldeas de Palestina; es decir, pone su vida ofrecida en manos del Padre (Lc 23, 46), quien lo hace salvación "para nosotros".



LOW GLUTEN HOSTS

We welcome any Catholic at any of the Holy Family churches who is gluten intolerant to receive special hosts at Mass. Anyone wanting

to receive a low gluten host (very low gluten) is welcome to learn how to receive in each church by contacting the priest or sacristan. He/she would simply find their hosts in the sacristy before Mass in the mini-refrigerator and place in a pyx and set on the tray or the chalice top so that they are consecrated by the priest during Mass. The priest or another minister who stands where the priest usually stands will then distribute them when coming forward for Holy Communion.

The pyx is labeled "Low Gluten" with a red cover at each church in our grouping. The pyx should be stored in the minifridge in each sacristy where the low gluten hosts are stored when not in use at Mass. If you go to the fridge to get the pyx and it is missing, then it is likely already out for someone else who is receiving LG-Hosts.

El Resucitado no se apareció a los fariseos ni al Sanedrín, o en el templo, para demostrar al mundo entero que está vivo y que ha vencido la muerte, sino que se apareció a los suyos; solo ellos y, su testimonio, son la prueba de que Jesús ha resucitado.

Por el misterio pascual, el Padre sella la nueva alianza y genera un nuevo pueblo, que tiene por fundamento su amor gratuito de Padre que salva (DA 143); sin embargo, hay cristianos que aceptan la resurrección pero se olvidan que el camino para llegar a ella es la cruz, el servicio, la donación de la propia vida.
