Paper Pulpit

"Some Magi from the East arrived in Bethlehem searching for the newborn king. When they saw the child with his mother Mary, they bowed down and worshipped him. They brought out their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, and presented them to him." Matthew 2:11

Who are the Magi? Are they Kings? Wise men? We'll discuss at Mass this weekend.

We all know that the magi brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Were Jesus, Mary and Joseph now rich with all the gold? The gifts of the Magi are symbolic. Gold is the "king of metals" and is symbolic of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is used in worship and is symbolic of Jesus' priesthood. Jesus is the one and only Priest. I am a priest in that Jesus established to baptize, marry, bury, forgive sins, offer Mass, and to be a visible sign of His priesthood. Myrrh is used in burials and is symbolic of Jesus' humanity and death on the cross. Jesus is King of Kings, Priest of Priests and Lord of lords.

Epiphany occurs on January 6 (or closest Sunday), which commemorates the "manifestation" of God through Christ to the whole world symbolized by the three Magi (Mt 2:1-12). The image of the three wise men from the East kneeling before the Christ child has been an inspiring symbol of worship for countless generations. It offers the structure for prayers of adoration and song... 'We three kings of orient are .' The story has always fascinated people because it links Jesus to the wider world of the orient and to the mysteries of the heavens. It reminds us that we too must bring our gifts to Christ and kneel before Him and worship Him.

Yet not all are willing to bow down (genuflect) and worship (Mass) Jesus. The word used today for "bow down" is genuflection. As we celebrate the Epiphany we are reminded that we must bow down and worship Jesus and offer Him our gifts. Jesus came over 2000 years ago and He comes at every Mass in the Holy Eucharist. Yet some Catholics choose to not attend Mass weekly (outside covid). Some say I can pray to Jesus in my own way. But that is not what Jesus teaches. Did you know that going all the way back to the beginning of the Bible God demanded people worship? That's why the Church has always taught that missing Mass (even once (outside covid)) is a mortal sin. God demands it. Some have stopped worshipping Jesus altogether. We need to invite them back. We must follow the example of the magi by worshipping Jesus each week at Mass.

Epiphany of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated either on January 6 or, according to the decision of the episcopal conference, on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8. The young Messiah is revealed as the light of the nations. Yet, as the antiphon for the Magnificat at Second Vespers reminds us, three mysteries are encompassed in this solemnity: the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, the Baptism of Christ and the wedding feast at Cana. Extra candles and/or lamps may be placed around the sanctuary and in other parts of the church to honor Christ revealed as the Light of the Gentiles (Ceremonial of Bishops). It is customary to replace the images of the shepherds at the crib with the three Magi and their gifts.

O God of light and peace, whose glory, shining in the child of Bethlehem, still draws the nations to yourself: bless us abundantly and dispel the darkness that shrouds our path, that, like the wise men, we may come to kneel before Christ in true worship, offer him our hearts and souls, and return from his presence to live as he has taught, now and for ever and ever. Amen.
