OUTREACH MINISTRY/VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Our **Outreach Ministry** has resumed, and we are in need of more volunteers to bring Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to attend Mass in person.

The Problem: Among the losses from COVID 19 was our ability to bring Holy Eucharist to the homebound and those in extended care facilities. Now we can begin to visit these places once again. However, the pandemic has greatly reduced the number of volunteers still available to perform this vital mission of our parish. We need many more new volunteers for this work of mercy.

Your Role: After a brief training period, you would bring Holy Communion to your assigned parishioners on a schedule which you and the Parish Staff/Priests would determine. You would choose the frequency, number, and location of those you would visit and there is flexibility in this process.

The Rewards: The persons you visit are able to receive the Holy Eucharist and to discuss their faith, joys, and struggles with you. You may be their only contact with our Catholic faith, and you give them a vital link to the sacraments. You are serving as an extension of priestly ministry and can alert the Priests if their presence may be needed---particularly in the Anointing of the Sick. This ministry is richly rewarding, and you will likely develop a special bond with those you are serving. By comforting the afflicted and with prayer you are performing spiritual works of mercy. In visiting the sick you are also doing a corporal work of mercy. This service should deepen your own spirituality as you progress in your own pilgrimage with our Lord.

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19 (47B)

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5a

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

April 16, 2021

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Happy Easter! In the Gospel reading on this third Sunday of Easter, we hear Jesus invite us to be witnesses of what we have experienced with Him. “Appearing before the disciples, Jesus gave them precisely what they needed for the next phase of their mission. He reassured and strengthened them by replacing their fear and uncertainty with peace and joy. He made the Scriptures intelligible to them...Just as He prepared the disciples for their mission, so He will prepare us for ours.” (Kate Larson, Living with Christ Sunday Missal)

Someone who seemed to live his vocation well was Prince Philip, the late husband of Queen Elizabeth II. In 2014, the royal couple met with Pope Francis at the Vatican, and the Pope gave Philip a series of three medals of his pontificate. “How much we will miss Prince Philip’s presence and character, so full of life and vigor,” said the president of the Bishop’s Conference of England and Wales, Cardinal Nichols, in a statement issued on April 9th. “He has been an example of steadfast loyalty and duty cheerfully given.”

While I do not keep up with the royal family and all their drama, I do admire Queen Elizabeth II and thus found intriguing an article in AARP Magazine written by Bryan Kozlowski and subtitled, “At 94, the world’s longest-reigning monarch still follows these 10 rules for staying vital.” Among the “10 rules”, these stood out for me as descriptive of a Christian woman: “Develop your sense of purpose. The queen lives for something larger than herself...Serve others. The patron of hundreds of charities, Elizabeth II believes that giving herself to good causes can do ‘as much as anything... to help me put my own worries into perspective.’ (Cultivate gratitude.) As Elizabeth II observed at one point, ‘The trouble with gloom is that it feeds upon itself.’ Be open to change. ‘Change has become a constant,’ she remarked in 2002. ‘The way we embrace it defines our future.’ Cherish your crowning years. Elizabeth II smiles more nowadays and is more warmly approachable than ever. All of this supports the scientific phenomenon known as the U-bend of life – the discovery that the world’s happiest people tend to be those who are in their 80s and beyond. And especially, Keep the faith. The queen attends church every Sunday and prays every night before bed, grounding rites that have been an essential component of her iconic resilience. Whatever worries the world throws at her, she believes there is a higher throne on which to lay them.”

May the peace of God be with Elizabeth II and all who have lost a loved one. At our parish, we have had many funerals recently. While we usually see Easter as a time of joy, the nine Easter Gospels – those from Holy Saturday through Divine Mercy Sunday – also provide powerful lessons on grief, points out Susan Erschen in “Embracing Resurrection”, Our Sunday Visitor, 4/4/21. For instance, in the Gospel of Monday in the Octave of Easter (Matt 28:10), Jesus says, ‘Do not be afraid.’ These encouraging words from the resurrected Christ can give us the hope to “stand firm, trusting in the Lord, knowing that beyond the sadness, oppression, and inevitability of death, the last word will be His, and it will be a word of mercy, of life, and of peace,” says Pope Francis. And on the Saturday in the Octave of Easter (Mark 16:15): “Jesus said to them, ‘Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature.’ “Death of a loved one leaves each of us with a mission, too. If we are breathing, we have a mission. The Holy Spirit is waiting to help us carry it out.” In this Sunday’s Gospel, listen as the Risen Lord prepares us too for our mission!

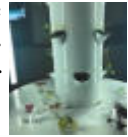
NEWS FROM SACRED HEART SCHOOL

Fourth Grade

In fourth grade, students completed their persuasive articles on the Midwest Region of the United States in Social Studies class. They are working on becoming experts on multiplying fractions in math class. They are such a talented group!

8th Grade Science is Fun!

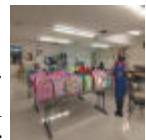
8th grade is studying the five methods of reproduction. Our students are the “parents” of new coleus plants, shown here. Coleus uses vegetative propagation. They have also planted Wisconsin Fast Plants, which are about to flower after only three weeks. We will selectively pollinate plants and be able to sprout the resulting seeds before school is out to document the inheritance of traits. Tomorrow we are going to segment black worms and watch them grow into new worms. This is fragmentation. This week we will also view live budding hydra under the microscope. The only mode of reproduction we will not do in class is spores.
