And I do not know which I shall choose. I am caught between the two. I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit. Only, conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ.

Gospel MT 20:1-16A

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just. So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day? They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Existing Altar Servers will train from 10:45am to 11:15am. Reflection from Deacon Mac Hill—Life is Christ What is my attitude when everything seems to be going wrong for me? Most of us become frustrated and impatient if we're honest with ourselves. Maybe we start to doubt ourselves. "What did I do wrong?" Or we start to doubt God and His goodness, "I've done everything right, why is this happening to me?" St. Paul, in Philippians 1:20-24, 27, speaks to us poignantly in today's second reading about this theme. He is writing this letter from prison. As he tells us in 2 Corinthians 11, he has been imprisoned multiple times. Not only that, he has been shipwrecked, flogged, stoned, left for dead, he has gone hungry and poorly clad, and most painfully for him, he has been rejected by almost all of his own people. Yet he sees things differently. St. Paul can say, and we can say with him, "my eager expectation and hope is that I shall not be put to shame in any way, but that with all boldness, now as always, Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me life is Christ, and death is gain." He sees life with a holy indifference. All that matters to him is to live in union with Christ crucified. Everything that happens to him after that is left to God's providence. Would that we could live the same thing, indifferent to the outcomes of our endeavors, as long as God is glorified through us! What would this disposition of St. Paul look like in our lives? We would be completely trusting in God's providence, even when it seems like everything is going wrong. We could say "Christ will be magnified in my body whether I'm healthy or ill," "Christ will be magnified in my home whether we're rich or poor," "Christ will be magnified in my life whether I'm recognized at work or I go unnoticed." Married couples could say, "Christ will be magnified in our marriage whether we are fertile or infertile." Elderly people could say "Christ will be magnified in my life whether I'm respected or forgotten." How is this possible? Because Jesus has entered into, and made holy, every single aspect of human life. There is nothing that cannot be sanctified (elevated to God and made holy). Would that we embrace this mindset, so that for us, "life is Christ, and death is gain."

The Diocese of St. Augustine for Parents who Home School Their Children

- 1. Families must register with the parish and be in communication with the religious education office.
- Home school families are defined as those families who provide education, including religious faith formation, in their homes following a standardized curriculum. Families who seek to use the parish program for religious education only when it is convenient with the scheduling of secular activities are not covered in this definition of home school family.
- 3. Families are obligated to use the same religious education text as the parish religious education program during the sacramental years.
- 4. The Pastor or his delegate for religious education should require a periodic progress report to be made by home school parents.
- 5. Home School families must submit enrollment document from the Home School Program for previous and current year.
