Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the upcoming months, our parish is going to work with St. Damian Parish in Oak Forest and St. Christopher in Midlothian as part of a group to discuss, share, pray, and discern what the best structures and forms of collaboration are to create a sustainable, vibrant and vital Catholic presence in our area.

The Renew My Church Team has invited leaders from each parish to form a Grouping Feedback and Discernment Team (GFDT), made up of the pastor and six people from each parish.

The GFDT began meeting September 1st to discuss and prayerfully discern the ministerial and operational strengths and challenges of the parishes and schools within our particular grouping. Eventually the team will provide feedback and information about our grouping for archdiocesan leadership to review and present recommendations to Cardinal Cupich so he can make final decisions regarding potential changes to school and parish structures.

Along the way, there will be opportunities for everyone in our own parish to learn about the details of those conversations, ask questions, and share their own points of view on the strengths and concerns of any potential changes.

First, the purpose of our GFDT is to draw close to the Lord as a community of believers from across our grouping parishes. We also call upon the Holy Spirit as we prayerfully discern spiritual and structural renewal, or more specifically, models of collaborative parish structures that present the most viable scenarios to effectively carry out the spiritual renewal and mission of the Church in our area.

Second, the discussions the GFDT will have ultimately result in a feedback summary report submitted to the Archdiocese. This feedback will be vital input regarding how our parishes will be structured in the future.

Like you, all those who are part of the team have ideas, concerns, frustrations and hopes about what renewal can look like for our local community in the future. As in the Parable of the Sower, we must be the rich soil where seeds can be sown in order to hear with our ears and understand with our hearts. We must pray that, above all, we allow the Holy Spirit to guide our thoughts, our words and our actions in this important work.

En los siguientes meses, nuestra parroquia va a trabajar con las parroquias San Damian en Oak Forest y San Christopher en Midlothian como parte de un grupo para discutir, compartir, rezar y discernir cuáles son las mejores estructuras y formas de colaboración para crear una presencia católica sostenible, vibrante y vital.

El equipo de Renueva Mi Iglesia ha invitado a los líderes de cada parroquia a formar un equipo de evaluación y discernimiento de la agrupación (GFDT), compuesto por el párroco y seis personas de cada parroquia.

También invocamos al Espíritu Santo mientras discernimos en oración la renovación espiritual y estructural, o más específicamente, los modelos de estructuras parroquiales colaborativas que presentan los casos más viables para llevar a cabo eficazmente la renovación espiritual y la misión de la Iglesia.

En segundo lugar, las discusiones que el GFDT tendrá en última instancia resultarán en un informe de evaluación que se presentará a la Arquidiócesis. Esta evaluación será una aportación vital sobre cómo se estructurarán nuestras parroquias en el futuro.

Al igual que ustedes, todos los que forman parte del equipo tienen ideas, preocupaciones, frustraciones y esperanzas sobre cómo puede ser la renovación de nuestra comunidad en el futuro. Como en la parábola del sembrador, debemos ser la tierra rica en la que se puedan sembrar las semillas para escuchar con nuestros oídos y comprender con nuestros corazones. Debemos rezar para que, sobre todo, dejemos que el Espíritu Santo guíe nuestros pensamientos, nuestras palabras y nuestras acciones en esta importante labor.

Grandpa was born in 1886 and he was pretty much like all grandpas. He would ask us if we wanted chocolate cake for dessert, Of course we'd shout "yes!" Then he'd say, "Well, we don't have any." For some reason we remember this with great affection.

Will You be My Grandparents?

It was just the three of us—my parents and me. We lived in a small house in Brighton, Colorado. We moved there on my third birthday. There weren't any kids my age in the neighborhood, so I mostly played in the yard with the dogs. I had a lot of imaginary friends—a whole family, actually, with a husband, in-laws, children, a best friend... no joke. My first clear memory is our neighbor Arlene handing me strawberries from her garden through a hole in the chain-link fence. She and her husband, Bill, lived next door.

Arlene spent a lot of time working in the garden, and I was always talking to her from our yard. I was a chatterbox. I think what drew me to Arlene and Bill is that they never got tired of listening to me gab.

One day, my parents asked Bill and Arlene whether they'd watch me while they went out on a date. This became a some-what monthly occurrence. Arlene and Bill didn't have kids. They had a spare room in their house, which became "my" room. Arlene and I would do crafts together. We were always putting tiny sequins on things. Bill taught me how to ride a bike and later how to drive the lawn tractor and eventually a car (stick and automatic). He was always fixing something in his garage and I would wander over to chatter at him, and he would always stop and listen to me, just like Arlene did.

When I was about five, I had an idea. My parents were watching TV when I spit it out: "What if I adopted Bill and Arlene as my grandparents?"

My parents agreed and the next day I knocked on Bill and Arlene's door, sat down in their living room, and said, "Will you guys be my grand-parents?" They started crying and enthusiastically accepted. Soon after, they printed out an adoption certificate, and it hung on their living room wall from then on. Thinking of that moment still brings tears to my eyes. There is something truly magnificent about a child offering up her love and adults being so eager to accept it.

Over the years, Bill and Arlene Howe supported me in all my dreams. They encouraged me to apply for college, even though I didn't have the money to go. And when I got accepted to Colorado State University, they presented me with a fund. They told me they'd been putting away money since the day I adopted them. It took me five years, but I graduated with a degree in forest management, and now I work for our state forest service.

Arlene passed away in 2013, two days before our adoption anniversary. Bill gave her eulogy. At the end, he said, "Arlene leaves behind her husband, Bill. And the greatest joy of her life, her granddaughter, Katie."



After the funeral, Bill gave me the ring he'd gifted to Arlene on their 25th wedding anniversary. It's a simple gold band that I wear on my ring finger as a reminder of the kind of love I wish to put into this world.
