

Renew My Church: A Call to Humility, Trust, Hope and Charity

As our Grouping Team continues the strenuous task of prayerfully discerning and thoughtfully discussing the strengths and weaknesses of the various scenarios presented a few weeks ago, we would do well to keep a few scriptural passages in mind:

"Then an argument broke out among them about which of them should be regarded as the greatest. He said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them and those in authority over them are addressed as 'Benefactors'; but among you it shall not be so. Rather, let the greatest among you be as the youngest, and the leader as the servant. For who is greater: the one seated at table or the one who serves? Is it not the one seated at table? I am among you as the one who serves. (Luke 22: 23-27)

I encourage all of us to meditate on this passage and its impact for our own lives and, in a special way, our thoughts as to what might be best for the future of our parish and our place in the renewal of the Church for the entire Chicagoland area. We are called to serve one another.

The Renew My Church prayer that we shared at the beginning of this process and that is prayed by our Grouping Team at every meeting offers these intentions:

Pour out the gift of your Holy Spirit upon us, and so enable us

to hear you clearly

to listen to each other attentively

to imagine our future boldly

to discern your direction wisely

to stay together in charity

to surrender our own plans readily

to embrace the greater good

to hand on your gifts to future generations.

Let us continue to make these intentions our own as a daily expression of our love for and hope in Jesus Christ, His Church and our entire Archdiocesan faith community.



- Wednesday, Oct.13, St. Christopher parish hosted *Session* 5 of *Renew My Church*. Participants discussed the pros and cons of uniting St. Stanislaus and St. Christopher Parishes to form a larger parish. On the positive side, unifying the parishes would solve our financial problems here at St. Stanislaus. On the negative side, there is a clear possibility that our church will close and parishioners would have to find a new home at either St. Christopher's or St. Damian's. Remember: nothing has been decided yet!
- Father Ortiz made it clear that parishioners at our townhall meetings overwhelmingly spoke in favor of getting a two-year "reprieve" before unifying parishes. During that time we would work to prove that we could raise enough money to pay our regular bills, hoping that the Archdiocese would set aside the debt for the time being.

Anne Marie Loizon, née Smaga, age 85, died peacefully on October 10th, 2021. Before moving to Channahan, Illinois, "Marie" and her late husband Yves began family life here in Posen. Their children, Patrick, Philippe, Paul, Chantal,

and Yvette Loizon, attended St. Stanislaus School.

Her children, their spouses, and 13 grandchildren recall that growing up in her household was never dull, as she loved her family vehemently. Anne Marie raised all her children to be strong-willed and to always put family first. She will be remembered for her beautiful waltzes, honest advice, and her incredible tenacity.



Samuel A Nicotra died October 2, 2021. He was 87. Sam was born in 1934 in Pittsburgh, PA. A Navy veteran of the Korean War, he proudly served his country from 1952 – 1956. He met and married his beautiful wife Nancy in 1953. He is survived by Nancy, 5 children: Sam (Ellen) Nicotra, Tom (Kris) Nicotra, Sandy (Kevin) Czajkowski, Laurie (Scott) Elbe, and Kristi (Paul) Schu; 14 grandchildren, and 15 greatgrandchildren.

Couture Family Terry & Maurice Children: Philip, Peter, Paul, Maureen, Suzanne, John

The whole family attended St. Stanislaus School, except Maurice, "a foreigner," born in Canada, migrating to the U.S. as an infant. All remember their years at St. Stan's fondly, including Mom Terry, who likes to reminisce about the nuns. (Sister Symphorose was her favorite.)

"I remember Father Rozak, the little old church, and our 2-story school. We had an ice skating rink and a toboggan slide just to the left of the school. I remember summer school when we were introduced to the 'big city' Chicago and the Museum of Science and Industry. We had a marching band and even won first place in the Humbolt Park competition (mainly because of our lovely majorettes, Blondie and Boots).

Father Rozak had a dog named Sooner. One snowy day, Father had all the school children come outside. He sent Sooner running down McKinley street and the kids after him to see who could catch him first. Many more fond and funny memories come to mind.

Fast forward—Maurice and I were married in St. Stanislaus Church. The next generation came along and found their way to our parish school. As parents, Maurice and I were grateful for the excellent education the nuns provided, as well as the many programs that kept our parish family together . . . Mothers' Club, Athletic Club, Holy Name, Rosary Ladies . . . There were fashion shows, fish fries, fiestas, and, of course, BINGO! Our gym was in constant use. Maurice served on the athletic board. I took my turn as president of Mother's Club, and the Altar and Rosary Society.

While going to college, Philip and his friend David Wiersma coached the St. Stanislaus Raiders because John was on the team . . . There is so much more to say . . . Living in this community, my family has been blessed in so many ways. Thank you, God, for St. Stanislaus Church. Special thanks to Father Pius for his kindness and deep concern for our parish."





Drwal Family Frank & Mary Rose Children: Charlotte, Frances, Teresa

Frank and Mary Rose Drwal moved to Posen in 1922. They had 3 daughters: Charlotte, Frances, and Terry. All 3 of them spent most of their lives in Posen, active members of our parish. Charlotte married Leo Sledd and had 3 children: Greg, David, and Mary Sue. Terry, the youngest Drwal daughter, married Maurice Couture. The Couture children are: Philip, Peter, Paul, Maureen, Suzanne, and John.



Terry, who once authored South Town's "Nosin' in Posen," currently belongs to the Altar and Rosary Society, and has often lent her artistic talents to decorating for church holidays and special events.

Frances Drwal, known as "Pani" to many students and neighbors," devoted much of her time to preserving Polish traditions in our parish and around Chicago. A teacher by profession, Frances taught Polish and English at several nearby schools. In addition, "Pani" organized a Polish



dance troupe involving St. Stanislaus children who performed at local restaurants and nursing homes. She also introduced learners, youths and adults, to the art of "Wycinanki", Polish paper ornaments cut in intricate, symmetrical designs.

In the early 90's, Ms. Drwal put our pastor Fr. Krolczyk in touch with Polish artist Richard Orski. Orski created the bas-relief woodcarvings of the Risen Christ and St. Stanislaus for our Centennial Celebration, and the carry cross we currently use at Mass. Frances died of cancer in 2003. Since 2007 the Christmas tree nearest our Czestachowa icon has been decorated with wycinanki in honor of Frances and our Polish parish ancestors.
