Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Today we are reminded in two ways to be persistent missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. In his message for World Mission Sunday, the Holy Father encourages us, "As Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves: the Church's evangelizing mission finds outward fulfilment in the transformation of our world and in the care of creation." At the same time, with the opening of the Synodal Process around the world, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium" (Address for the ceremony commemorating the 50th anniversary of the institution of the Synod of Bishops, 17 October 2015).

We celebrate World Mission Sunday with the Universal Church on October 24, offering prayer and reflection on our mission to proclaim the gospel to all the nations. The collection taken this day supports over 1,000 mission dioceses through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. These local churches are the poorest in the world and yet they joyfully share the Lord and provide hope amidst struggles in Africa, Asia and remote areas of Latin America and the Pacific Islands. The collection also provides for mission dioceses in the Middle East, Northeast Africa, India and Eastern Europe through the Catholic Near East Welfare Association.

Also, during this time, The Church of God is convoked in Synod. Today, the Archdiocese of Chicago is celebrating the opening of the process for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, in October 2023. The theme of this synod is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission" and so is intimately tied to our celebration of World Mission.

This global pandemic has highlighted the peripheries of our world and the importance of widening our circles to reach out to neighbors both nearby and far away. Let this celebration of World Mission Sunday and the opening of the Synodal Process be an opportunity for pause and prayerful solidarity with our sisters and brothers in faith around the world. May we give thanks for their witness and recommit ourselves to our own call to be missionary disciples. With every wish, I remain.

Estimadas Hermanas y Hermanos en Cristo,

Hoy se nos recuerda ser discípulos misioneros persistentes de Jesucristo de dos maneras. En su mensaje para el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, el Santo Padre nos alienta: "Los cristianos no podemos reservar al Señor para nosotros mismos: la misión evangelizadora de la Iglesia expresa su implicación total y pública en la transformación del mundo y en la custodia de la creación". Al mismo tiempo, con la apertura del Proceso Sinodal alrededor del mundo, el papa Francisco invita a la Iglesia entera a reflexionar sobre un tema que es decisivo para su vida y misión: "Precisamente el camino de la sinodalidad es el camino que Dios espera de la Iglesia del tercer milenio". (Discurso para la ceremonia de conmemoración del 50 aniversario de la institución del Sínodo de los Obispos, 17 de octubre de 2015).

Celebramos el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones con la Iglesia Universal el 24 de octubre, ofreciendo oración y reflexión sobre nuestra misión para proclamar el evangelio a todas las naciones. La colecta que se recoge este día apoya a más de 1,000 diócesis misioneras a través de la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe. Estas iglesias locales son las más pobres en el mundo y sin embargo comparten alegremente al Señor y proveen esperanza en medio de las dificultades en África, Asia y áreas remotas de América Latina y las Islas del Pacífico. La colecta también provee para las diócesis misioneras en el Medio Oriente, el noreste de África, India y Europa del Este a través de la Asociación Católica de Bienestar del Cercano Oriente (Catholic Near East Welfare Association).

También durante este tiempo, la Iglesia de Dios es convocada en sínodo. Hoy, la Arquidiócesis de Chicago está celebrando la apertura del proceso para la XVI Asamblea General Ordinaria del Sínodo de los Obispos, en octubre de 2023. El tema de este sínodo es "Por una Iglesia sinodal: comunión, participación, y misión" y así está íntimamente vinculada a nuestra celebración de la Misión Mundial.

Esta pandemia global ha resaltado las periferias de nuestro mundo y la importancia de ampliar nuestros círculos para llegar al prójimo tanto cerca como lejos. Que esta celebración del Domingo Mundial de las Misiones y la apertura del Proceso Sinodal sea una oportunidad para la pausa y la solidaridad en oración con nuestras hermanas y hermanos de fe alrededor del mundo. Que podamos dar gracias por su testimonio y nos volvamos a comprometer con nuestro propio llamado a ser discípulos misioneros. Con cada deseo, permanezco.



Gospel Reflection: Amazing Grace

John Newton was a captain of slave ships and became an investor in the slave trade but later converted to Christianity and worked to abolish slavery in Great Britain.

Newton went to sea at a young age and worked on slave ships for several years. In 1745, he himself became a slave of Princess Peye, a woman of the Sherbro people. He was rescued, returned to sea and the trade ships. After retiring from active sea-faring, he continued to invest in the slave trade. Some years after experiencing a conversion to Christianity, Newton renounced his trade and became a prominent supporter of abolitionism. He was ordained a cleric to the Church of England and served as parish priest in Buckinghamshire for two decades. In his famous hymn "Amazing Grace", Rev. Newton describes his own enlightenment:

Amazing grace! How sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see.

Let us also pray for spiritual sight. Each one of us suffers from spiritual blindness at times. Anger, prejudice, jealousy, anxiety, and doubt can make us spiritually blind and prevent us from seeing the goodness of life, the goodness of other people, and the presence of God among us. Hence, let us pray to have a clear vision of Christian values and priorities in our lives. A clear spiritual vision enables us to see the goodness in ourselves and others, and to begin and end each day with an attitude of gratitude.
