

Now that we are winding down the celebrations of First Holy Communion, we turn our attention to one last group in the parish who missed their big sacramental day because of the coronavirus shutdown. This year's confirmation class was scheduled to be confirmed along with the class from St. Barbara Parish in Harrison City by Bishop Malesic back in May. Since so many confirmations had to be cancelled, the bishop has delegated the pastors of parishes in the diocese to confirm this year's confirmation candidates. We have scheduled confirmation liturgies on four weekday evenings over the coming weeks—beginning Tuesday—so that our 28 confirmation candidates can receive this sacrament of Christian maturity. As our young people celebrate confirmation, please keep them in your prayers that they may always remain open to the Holy Spirit's inspiration and guidance on their journeys of faith.

The Parish Pastoral Council is scheduled to meet on August 11, for our second meeting since the restart at the beginning of the summer. Our earlier meeting was a chance for me to update the council on happenings during the coronavirus shutdown and to get ourselves back on track. At the time of the shutdown we were reviewing all of the feedback from January's Parish Assembly to begin preparing a Parish Pastoral Plan, with the hopes of presenting it to the parish by Memorial Day. We will be resuming that work, in hopes of having a plan to present before Thanksgiving. I will keep you posted as the work progresses.

On Tuesday the Church celebrates the feast of **St. John Vianney**, patron saint of parish priests. Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney was born near Lyons, France in 1786. There were many obstacles to young John's pursuit of a priestly vocation; he had only a very limited education as a child and was not particularly adept at "book learning", as we might call it today. He was conscripted into the French army, as many young men were, during the reign of Napoleon Bonaparte. By 1812 John Vianney finally was admitted to seminary studies, but continued to struggle as a student, largely because of his lack of grasp of Latin. He was ordained to the priesthood three years later and in 1818 was assigned to a parish in the small village of Ars, where he would serve until his death on August 4, 1859. John Vianney, who would become known as the Cure of Ars, soon became renowned for his deep personal spirituality and charity and for spiritual direction. He was known to spend up to 16 hours a day hearing confessions in the summertime as pilgrims flocked to his tiny village church from throughout France and around Europe. Bishops, other priests, and young men and women discerning priestly and religious vocations sought out his spiritual advice and guidance, which was noted for its common sense and deep insight.

As we celebrate the feast day of this remarkable man it is an appropriate time to be reminded of the need to **pray for your priests**, **seminarians**, **and those young men considering a priestly vocation**. I know I can speak for my brother priests, throughout the diocese and beyond, when I say how humbled and grateful we are for the generosity and support of so many. This is especially important in the difficult times the Church, and the priesthood in particular, have been facing in recent years. Please also pray for seminarians, as they discern God's call and are actively preparing for priestly service in the Church. At present there are **only seven** men in various stages of priestly formation for the Diocese of Greensburg. They are completing summer pastoral assignments and are preparing for the beginning of another academic year later this month. Finally, continue to pray for the men who are considering and discerning a priestly vocation; they need our prayers and support. *If you know of someone who you think might make a good priest, let him know.* Encouraging and fostering the vocations of tomorrow's priests is not just the job of today's priests and bishops, but it the job of *everyone* in today's Church!

Some things bear repeating, like always remembering to say "Thank You".
