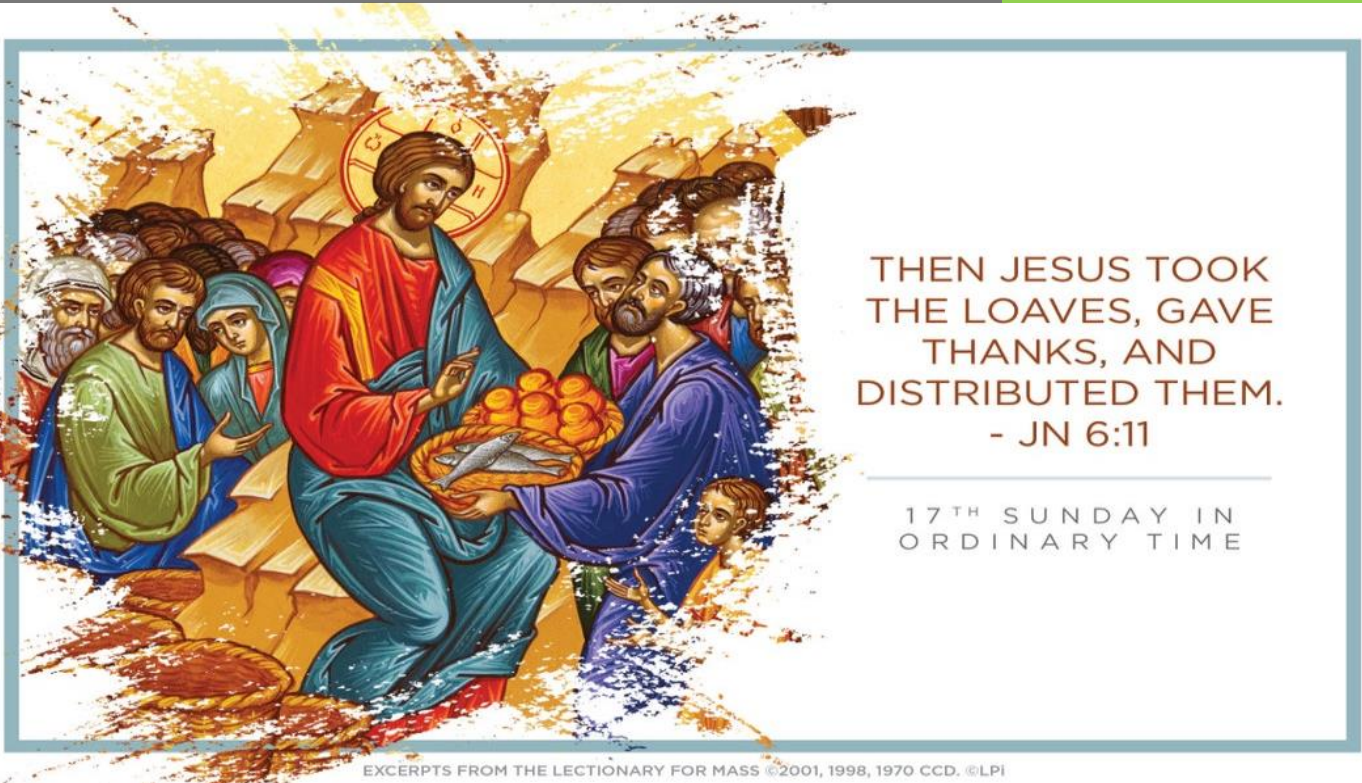

PAROCHIAL PATRONESS:

We are fortunate to have St. Therese as our patron saint! Her life is inspiring! I used to wonder

how a contemplative Carmelite nun was named as co-patroness of missionaries. I recently learned that two priests had contacted the convent where she lived to request prayers prior to their mission trip. St. Therese prayed for them and also corresponded with them and with some missionary nuns in her religious order. The conversion of a tribal leader in the Arctic was attributed to her intercessory prayers and the foundering mission was saved. Pope Pius XI declared her a patroness of missionaries in 1927, thirty years after her death.

She was named a Doctor of the Church by St. John Paul II. Since the 13th century, only 36 saints have been given this title, which signifies that a person's writings and teachings are worthy of our study and reflection. During his pontificate of 26 years, St. John Paul II canonized over 400 saints, but he only declared one saint to be a Doctor of the Church. She was not a theologian or scholar, but the pope

considered her to be one of the greatest modern day saints. Through her *Little Way* and child-like trust, she is a shining star in the communion of saints. Her little book, *Story of a Soul* has inspired the faithful since it was first published and has been translated into the major languages of the world.

Another significant fact of her family is that her four older sisters were also Carmelite nuns and that their parents

are canonized saints. When Louis Martin and his bride, Zélie, were married in 1858, they promised that they would "serve God first" together. They knew that putting God first in their lives would always help them to trust and to persevere. Louis was a watchmaker and Zélie made beautiful lace to help support their growing family. They taught their children to know, love, and

serve God. The Catholic Church was the center of their family life. Like all married couples, they sometimes faced hardships and sadness as four of their nine children died at a young age. They turned to God and grew more deeply in love as they shared their joys and sorrows. When Thérèse, the youngest daughter, was only four years old, Zélie became very ill and died. The family was brokenhearted, but they

remembered that Zélie prayed with them to help them understand that her illness and death was part of God's plan.

Louis lovingly raised his daughters. He generously gave his permission as each one asked to join the convent. He saw this as a sign that God was pleased that he and Zélie had shared their faith and love with their children. Zélie and Louis Martin's lives show us that when we live with love, we grow in holiness.

The Martins are such a wonderful example of holiness that Pope Benedict named them "Blessed" in 2008 and Pope Francis officially canonized them both as saints in 2015. They are the first married couple to ever be canonized together. They are an inspiration to us!

PATRONA PARROQUIAL:

¡Somos afortunados de tener a Santa Teresita como nuestra santa patrona! ¡Su vida es inspiradora! Solía preguntarme cómo una monja carmelita contemplativa fue nombrada copatrona de los misioneros. Recientemente supe que dos sacerdotes se habían puesto en contacto con el convento donde ella vivía para solicitar oraciones antes de su viaje misionero. Santa Teresa oró por ellos y también mantuvo correspondencia con ellos y con algunas monjas misioneras de su orden religiosa. La conversión de una líder tribal en el Ártico se atribuyó a sus oraciones de intercesión y se salvó la misión naufragada. El Papa Pío XI la declaró patrona de los misioneros en 1927, treinta años después de su muerte.

Fue nombrada Doctora de la Iglesia por San Juan Pablo II. Desde el siglo XIII, solo 36 santos han recibido este título, lo que significa que los escritos y las enseñanzas de una persona merecen nuestro estudio y reflexión. Durante su pontificado de 26 años, San Juan Pablo II canonizó a más de 400 santos, pero solo declaró a un santo como Doctor de la Iglesia. No era teóloga ni erudita, pero el Papa la consideraba de las más grandes santas de los últimos tiempos. A través de su *Caminito* y su confianza infantil, es una estrella brillante en la comunión de los santos. Su pequeño libro, *Historia de un Alma*, ha inspirado a los fieles

desde que se publicó por primera vez y ha sido traducido a los principales idiomas del mundo.

Otro dato significativo de su familia es que sus cuatro hermanas mayores también eran monjas carmelitas y que sus padres son santos canonizados. Cuando Louis Martin y su esposa, Zélie, se casaron en 1858, prometieron que "servirían

a Dios primero" juntos. Sabían que poner a Dios en primer lugar en sus vidas siempre les ayudaría a confiar y perseverar. Louis era relojero y Zélie hacía hermosos encajes para ayudar a mantener a su familia en crecimiento. Enseñaron a sus hijos a

conocer, amar y servir a Dios. La Iglesia Católica fue el centro de su vida familiar. Como todas las parejas casadas, a veces enfrentaron dificultades y tristeza ya que cuatro de sus nueve hijos murieron a una temprana edad. Se volvieron a Dios y se enamoraron más profundamente al compartir sus alegrías y tristezas. Cuando Thérèse, la hija menor, tenía solo cuatro años, Zélie se puso muy enferma y murió. La familia estaba desconsolada, pero recordaron que Zélie oró con ellos para ayudarlos a comprender que su enfermedad y muerte eran parte del plan de Dios.

Louis crió con amor a sus hijas. Generosamente dio su permiso cuando cada uno pidió unirse al convento. Vio esto como una señal de que Dios estaba complacido de que él y Zélie hubieran compartido su fe y amor con sus hijos. Las vidas de Zélie y Louis Martin nos muestran que cuando vivimos con amor, crecemos en santidad. Los Martin son un ejemplo tan maravilloso de santidad que el Papa Benedicto XVI los nombró "Beatos" en 2008 y el Papa Francisco los reconoció oficialmente como santos en 2015. Son la primera pareja casada en ser canonizada juntos. ¡Son una inspiración para nosotros!

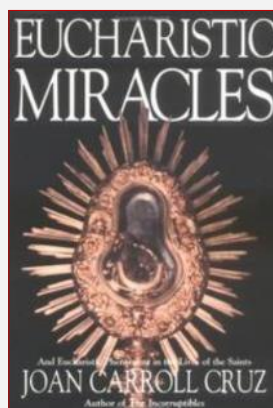

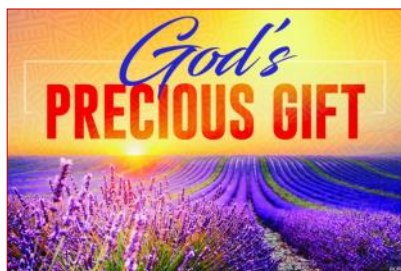
