

### **Pastor's Reflection**



#### **SANCTITY OF LIFE:**

The first Sunday of October has been designated as "Respect Life Sunday" and this theme continues throughout the month of October. The Catholic Church is a 'Pro Life' Church. While I recognize that politicians are all over the place on the issue of abortion, I personally

see this as a moral issue rather than solely a political one. One of the great sights that I see in our parish regularly is the presence of children with loving parents. We recognize the gift and the sanctity of each human life. We give thanks to God for our lives and for our families. The Bible begins with the story of creation. "God created the heavens and the earth with a purpose.

Only humanity was created in the image and likeness of God." [...] Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion . . .' God created man in His image; in the divine image He created him; male and female He created them." [Genesis 1:26-27] While we may never fully comprehend the mystery of life, we can be sure that each human life has been created by God. As a people of Faith, our belief that God is the author of life is central and foundational.

It follows that life should be respected and nurtured from conception to natural death. When asked about the greatest commandment of the Law, our Lord responded that: "You shall

love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." [Mt. 22:38-40]

In 1995, St. Pope John Paul II wrote the encyclical, The Gospel of Life. During his ministry as the Vicar of Christ, he consistently called the Faithful and the people of the world to respect life. In this encyclical, he wrote, "The texts of Sacred Scripture [...] show such great respect for the human being in the mother's womb that they require as a logical consequence that God's commandment 'You shall not kill' be extended to the unborn child as well. Human life is sacred and inviolable

at every moment of existence, including the initial phase, which precedes birth [...] when they are still in their mother's womb, [...] they are the personal objects of God's loving and fatherly providence." In the same encyclical, the Holy Father compassionately addressed women who have had abortions with the following words: "The wound in your heart may not have healed. [...] But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. ~ The Father of mercies is ready to give you His forgiveness and His peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation."

I encourage all to pray for the conversion of hearts of those who are opposed to God's precious gift of life, especially through the holy rosary. I appreciate those who participated in the Life Chain on October 3. A number of our parishioners have faithfully persevered

> in the Respect Life movement for many years. Some in our parish pray at the abortion centers and strive to offer the women entering these dark chambers the "life alternatives." I have been honored to stand beside some of these prayer warriors over the years!

> As I reflect on the divisions in our nation on life issues and on the increased secularism in society, I believe that dedicated respect life initiatives are now needed more than ever. I am pleased to support the efforts of the staff and volunteers at pregnancy care centers, maternity homes, hospitals, retirement homes, and parish and diocesan based charities. With perseverance, our

pastoral efforts will help to change the culture, perhaps one person at a time. Our good example with prayers and sacrifices will make a difference, beginning with our own hearts. Through His saving power, and with the prayerful intercession of Mary, our Blessed Mother, we can build a culture of life. "The defense of human life at its most vulnerable stages is an essential duty of those inspired by the Gospel." Together, let us continue the journey.

## Reflexión del Párroco

#### EL SANTIDAD DE LA VIDA:

El primer domingo de octubre ha sido designado como "Domingo de Respeto a la Vida" y este tema continúa durante todo el mes de octubre. La Iglesia Católica es una Iglesia "Pro Vida". Si bien reconozco que los políticos están por todas partes sobre el tema del aborto, personalmente veo esto como una cuestión moral y no únicamente política. Una de las grandes vistas que veo en nuestra parroquia con regularidad es la presencia de niños con padres amorosos. Reconocemos el don y la santidad de cada vida

Reconocemos el don y la santidad de cada vida humana. Damos gracias a Dios por nuestras vidas y nuestras familias. La Biblia comienza con la historia de

la creación. "Dios creó los cielos y la tierra con un propósito. Solo la humanidad fue creada a imagen y semejanza de Dios. " [...] Entonces Dios dijo: 'Hagamos al hombre a nuestra imagen, conforme a nuestra semejanza. Déjalos tener dominio' [...] Dios creó al hombre a su imagen; a imagen divina lo creó; varón y hembra los creó ". [Génesis 1: 26-27] Si bien es posible que nunca comprendamos completamente el misterio de la vida, podemos estar seguros de que cada

vida humana ha sido creada por Dios. Como pueblo de fe, nuestra creencia de que Dios es el autor de la vida es fundamental y fundamental.

De ello se deduce que la vida debe respetarse y nutrirse desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural. Cuando se le preguntó sobre el mayor mandamiento de la Ley, nuestro Señor respondió que: "Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente. Este es el mayor y el primer mandamiento. El segundo es semejante: amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Toda la ley y los profetas dependen de estos dos mandamientos". [Mt. 22: 38-40]

En 1995, el Papa Juan Pablo II escribió la encíclica El Evangelio de la vida. Durante su ministerio como Vicario de Cristo, llamó constantemente a los Fieles y a las personas del mundo a respetar la vida. En esta encíclica escribió: "Los textos de la Sagrada Escritura. . . muestran un respeto tan grande por el ser humano en el útero de la madre que exigen, como consecuencia lógica, que el mandamiento de Dios "No matarás" se extienda también al feto. La vida humana es sagrada e inviolable en cada momento de la existencia, incluida la fase inicial, que precede al nacimiento [...] cuando

todavía están en el útero de su madre, [...] son los objetos personales de la providencia amorosa y paternal de Dios ". En la misma encíclica, el Santo Padre se dirigió con compasión a las mujeres que habían tenido abortos con las siguientes palabras: "Puede que la herida de tu corazón no haya sanado. [...] Pero no cedas al desánimo y no pierdas la esperanza. ~ El Padre de misericordias está listo para darte Su perdón y Su paz en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación ".

Animo a todos a orar por la conversión de los corazones de quienes se oponen al precioso don de la vida de Dios, especialmente a través del santo rosario. Agradezco a quienes participaron en la Cadena de Vida

el 3 de octubre. Varios de nuestros feligreses han perseverado fielmente en el movimiento de Respeto a la Vida durante muchos años. Algunos en nuestra parroquia rezan en los centros de aborto y se esfuerzan por ofrecer a las mujeres que ingresan a estas cámaras oscuras las "alternativas de vida". ¡Me ha honrado estar al lado de algunos de estos guerreros de oración a lo largo de los años! Al reflexionar sobre las divisiones en nuestra nación sobre los problemas

de la vida y sobre el aumento del secularismo en la sociedad, creo que las iniciativas dedicadas al respeto por la vida son ahora más necesarias que nunca. Me complace apoyar los esfuerzos del personal y los voluntarios en los centros de atención del embarazo, hogares de maternidad, hospitales, hogares de ancianos y organizaciones benéficas parroquiales y diocesanas. Con perseverancia, nuestros esfuerzos pastorales ayudarán a cambiar la cultura, quizás una persona a la vez. Nuestro buen ejemplo con oraciones y sacrificios marcará la diferencia, comenzando con nuestro propio corazón. Mediante su poder salvador, y con la intercesión orante de María, nuestra Santísima Madre, podemos construir una cultura de vida. "La defensa de la vida humana en sus etapas más vulnerables es un deber esencial de los inspirados por el Evangelio". Juntos, continuemos el viaje.


## World Mission Sunday


