

Pastor's Reflection



THE HOLY SEASON OF ADVENT:

This weekend, the Church begins the season of Advent and a new liturgical year. The name of the season comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "arrival." In ancient times, the word was used to describe the

arrival of the

emperor or someone of importance. For Christians, the term is used in the context of our preparation and "joyful anticipation" for the coming of Christ. Regarding Advent, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first

coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming." [# 524] There is, therefore, a two-fold character of Advent. In the first sense, Advent is a season to prepare to celebrate Christ's first coming as a child born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem. Through the Incarnation, Heaven was joined to earth. In the Masses of Advent, we will hear prophesies of the Old Testament and recall how the people of Faith waited for the promised Messiah and the time of fulfillment. The second character of Advent encourages us to prepare for Christ's return in glory at the end of the age. The Lord has said that we should be prepared for His return. This is emphasized during the first two weeks of Advent. From the Gospel this Sunday: Jesus tells His disciples (and us): "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

There are some specific symbols in Advent.

The liturgical color for Advent is violet, which represents sorrow, penitence and preparation. The third Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete Sunday* and the liturgical color is rose. *Gaudete* is a Latin word meaning rejoice and on this Sunday, we are given the assurance that the celebration of Christmas is near. The Advent wreath is a

popular symbol used in many parishes. Lighting a candle for the four Sundays of Advent symbolizes the coming of Christ, the true light of the world. The Gloria is omitted during Advent (except for the Feasts of the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe).

As a teacher, I remind our Faithful that the Christmas Season does not begin until the first Mass on Christmas Eve. Let us strive to maintain the integrity of Advent as a

time of joyful anticipation. There will be people all around us celebrating Christmas throughout Advent. During this busy time, I encourage you to reflect on your spiritual priorities. In the midst of all of our family and community activities, I encourage parishioners who are able to attend the daily Mass. I also suggest spending time in prayer and a family rosary. All should consider celebrating God's mercy and peace through the sacrament of penance during Advent. We always offer confessions on Saturdays, Sundays and by appointment. Together, we should remember the reason for the season. Let us prepare with joy and hope. Let us recall the acclamation of the early Church, "Maranatha!" [1 Cor. 16:20] "Come, Lord Jesus!"

Reflexión del Párroco

ACCIÓN DE GRACIAS:

T emporada Santa de Adviento: Este fin de semana, la Iglesia comienza la temporada de Adviento y un nuevo año litúrgico. El nombre de la temporada viene de la palabra latina adventus, que significa "Ilegada". En la antigüedad, se utilizó esta palabra para describir la llegada del emperador o alguien con importancia. Para

los cristianos, el término se utiliza en el contexto de nuestra preparación y "anticipación gozosa" para la venida de Cristo. Respecto de Adviento, el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica enseña: "Cuando la Iglesia celebra la liturgia de Adviento cada año, se actualiza esta esperanza del Mesías, por la participación en la larga preparación de la primera venida, los fieles renuevan del Salvador su ardiente deseo de su segunda venida". Hay, por tanto, un

doble carácter de Adviento. En el primer sentido, el Adviento es un tiempo para prepararse para celebrar la primera venida de Cristo como un niño nacido de la Virgen María en Belén. A través por la Encarnación, el Cielo se unió a la tierra. En las misas de Adviento, vamos a oír las profecías del Antiquo Testamento y recordar cómo la gente de fe esperaban el Mesías prometido y el tiempo de realización. El segundo carácter de Adviento nos anima a prepararnos para la venida de Cristo en gloria al final de los tiempos. El Señor ha dicho que debemos estar preparados para su regreso. Esto se acentúa durante las dos primeras semanas de Adviento. En el Evangelio de este domingo Jesús dice a sus discípulos (y nosotros): "Velen, pues, y hagan oración continuamente, para que puedan escapar de todo lo que ha de suceder y comparecer seguros ante el Hijo del hombre."

Hay algunos símbolos específicos en Adviento.

El color litúrgico de Adviento es el violeta, que representa la penitencia y preparación. El tercer domingo de Adviento se conoce como Domingo de Gaudete y el color litúrgico es rosa. La corona de Adviento es un símbolo popular utilizado en muchas parroquias. Encender una vela para los cuatro domingos

de Adviento simboliza la venida de Cristo, la luz verdadera del mundo. La Gloria se omite durante el Adviento. Debemos mantener la integridad del Adviento como un tiempo de alegre anticipación. Durante este tiempo ocupado, les animo a reflexionar sobre sus prioridades espirituales. En medio de todas nuestras actividades familiares y comunitarias, animo a los feligreses que son capaces de asistir a la misa diaria. Tal vez, más

familias se sumarán algún tiempo en oración, como un rosario en familia. Todos deben tener en cuenta la celebración de la misericordia y la paz de Dios a través del sacramento de la penitencia durante el Adviento. Tenemos la oportunidad hacer tu confesión sábados, domingos y por cita. Juntos, debemos recordar el motivo de la temporada. Preparémonos con alegría y esperanza. Recordemos la aclamación de la Iglesia primitiva, "¡Maranatha!" [1 Cor. 16:20] "¡Ven, Señor Jesús!"

Tithing in the Catholic Church

Offering money and other goods to God and the Church is, before all else, a statement of gratitude. We see this when we look at how our spiritual ancestors showed their gratitude to God for the gifts they had received (e.g. Genesis 14:18-20 and Genesis 28:16-22). One of the ways they offered thanks to God was through a practice called "tithing," in which 10 percent of a person's goods (crops, livestock, money, etc.) were given back to God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to [their] own abilities" (no. 2043). This means that, although we are not bound to practice "tithing" in the traditional sense, we do share a responsibility to share our money or other resources with our parish communities. Like our spiritual ancestors, we give as a sign of our gratitude for the many gifts that God has given to us.

How much we give depends on our individual circumstances, but since we share a responsibility for the programs, outreach, and health of our parish communities and Catholic organizations, this question gives us a wonderful opportunity to ask some important questions about the quality of our giving and what our priorities are. Remember, we are only stewards of our time, talents, and treasures and as the First Letter of Peter reminds us, "As each one of you has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied graces" (4:10).






