Pastor's Reflection



THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY:

The Sunday following the celebration of Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Divine Son of God was born in time and was a member of a family. Through the Incarnation, Jesus became one like us in all ways except for sin. He is

both Savior and Brother. This Feast should inspire us to strive for family life that is rooted in the unconditional love of God. Through the saving waters of baptism, we become members of the Family of God, the Church.

We are all aware that every family will face trials and challenges. Hopefully, with divine assistance, the families of our parish will remain strong and united. There may be storms, but through a life of Faith and the help of sanctifying grace, we will be able to persevere and to grow. The Scriptures teach us. Recall the Fouth Commandment: "Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the Lord, your God, is giving you." [Exodus 20:12] Parents, of course, should follow the model of the Good Shepherd in their care and guidance of their children. From the Letter to the Colossians, the apostle St. Paul provides guidance for community living. The family is referred to as the Domestic Church. The virtues expressed include: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience and forgiveness [See Colossians 3:12-17]. The apostle encourages the Faithful to bear with one another and to be thankful.

Ideally, the family home should be a place of harmony and unity. It is with sadness that I sometimes learn of bitter divisions within families. A man once told me that he had not spoken with a brother for twenty years. There is hope for reconciliation. Forgiveness is possible. Family love has its origin in God's love. The Spirit of God dwells within us. It is my prayer that God will bless our families on this Feast of the Holy Family. About thirty years ago, Saint John Paul II wrote an Apostolic Exhortation on the Role of the Christian Family in the Modern World. It is very impressive and timeless. I will conclude this Pastor's Reflection with the closing paragraphs of Saint John Paul's *Familiaris Consortio*:

"I wish to invoke the protection of the Holy Family of Nazareth.

Through God's mysterious design, it was in that family that the Son of God spent long years of a hidden life [...] St. Joseph was «a just man,» a tireless worker, the upright guardian of those entrusted to his care. May he always guard, protect and enlighten families.


May the Virgin Mary, who is the Mother of the Church, also be the Mother of «the Church of the home.» Thanks to her motherly aid, may each Christian family really become a «little Church» in which the mystery of the Church of Christ is mirrored and given new life. May she, the Handmaid of the Lord, be an example of humble and generous acceptance of the will of God. May she, the Sorrowful Mother at the foot of the Cross, comfort the sufferings and dry the tears of those in distress because of the difficulties of their families.

May Christ the Lord, the Universal King, the King of Families, be present in every Christian home as He was at Cana, bestowing light, joy, serenity and strength. On the solemn day dedicated to His Kingship I beg of Him that every family may generously make its own contribution to the coming of His Kingdom in the world - «a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace,» towards which history is journeying.

l entrust each family to Him, to Mary, and to Joseph."

LA FIESTA DE LA SAGRADA FAMILIA:

E I domingo siguiente a la celebración de la Navidad es la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José. El divino Hijo de Dios nació en tiempo y era un miembro de una familia. A través de la Encarnación, Jesús se convirtió en uno como nosotros en todos los aspectos excepto en el pecado. Él es nuestro Salvador y hermano. Esta fiesta debe inspirarnos a luchar por la vida familiar que tiene sus raíces en el amor incondicional de Dios. A través de las aguas salvadoras del bautismo, entramos en la Familia de Dios, la Iglesia.

Si bien este año ha sido una de muchas pruebas y desafíos, es de esperar que las familias de nuestra parroquia se hayan mantenido fuertes y unidas. A través de una vida de fe y la ayuda de la gracia santificante, que será capaz de soportar v crecer. Las Escrituras nos enseñan. Recordemos el cuarto mandamiento: "Honra a tu padre ya tu madre, para que tengan una larga vida en la tierra que el Señor, tu Dios, te da" [Éx. 20:12]. Los padres, por supuesto, deben seguir el modelo del Buen Pastor en su cuidado y orientación de sus hijos. De la Carta a los Colosenses, el apóstol San Pablo ofrece los motivos de la vida en comunidad. La familia se conoce como la lalesia doméstica. Las virtudes expresadas incluyen: la compasión, bondad, humildad, mansedumbre, paciencia y perdón [Ver Col. 3: 12-17]. El apóstol anima a los fieles a llevan entre sí y ser agradecidos. Idealmente, el hogar de una familia debe ser un lugar de armonía y unidad. Es con tristeza que me entero de amargas divisiones dentro de las familias. Una vez un hombre me dijo que no había hablado con un hermano por veinte años. Hay esperanza por la reconciliación. El perdón es posible. El amor en una familia tiene su origen en el amor de Dios. El Espíritu de Dios habita en nosotros. Es mi oración que Dios bendiga a nuestras familias en esta fiesta de la Sagrada Familia.

Hace treinta y dos años, San Juan Pablo II escribió una exhortación apostólica sobre el papel de la familia

cristiana en el mundo moderno. Es muy impresionante y atemporal. Quiero concluir esta reflexión con el último párrafo del *Familiaris Consortio:*

"Ahora, al concluir este mensaje pastoral, que quiere llamar la atención de todos sobre el cometido pesado pero atractivo de la familia cristiana, deseo invocar la protección de la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret. -[...] ¡Qué San José, «hombre justo», trabajador incansable, custodio integérrimo de los tesoros a él confiados, las guarde, proteja e ilumine siempre!

¡Qué la Virgen María, como es Madre de la Iglesia, sea también Madre de la «Iglesia doméstica», y, gracias a su ayuda materna, cada familia cristiana pueda llegar a ser verdaderamente una «pequeña Iglesia», en la que se refleje y reviva el misterio de la Iglesia de Cristo! Sea ella, Esclava del Señor, ejemplo de acogida humilde y generosa de la voluntad de Dios; sea ella, Madre Dolorosa a los pies de la Cruz, la que alivie los sufrimientos y enjugue las lágrimas de cuantos sufren por las dificultades de sus familias.

¡Qué Cristo Señor, Rey del universo, Rey de las familias, esté presente como en Caná, en cada hogar cristiano para dar luz, alegría, serenidad y fortaleza! A Él, en el día solemne dedicado a su Realeza, pido que cada familia sepa dar generosamente su aportación original para la venida de su Reino al mundo, «Reino de verdad y de vida, Reino de santidad y de gracia, Reino de justicia, de amor y de paz» hacia el cual está caminando la historia. 

Grandma's Ginger Snaps Fresh Ink by Kelli Olszewski, Director of Faith Formation

came across a paper I wrote my freshman year in college for my English class. It was entitled, "My Grandma". As I get older I realize how much she is still a part of my life every day. Whether it is just a sweet us, my girls and I look forward every childhood memory that passes my mind or sharing stories with my children, she is always present. Sometimes, especially during holidays I wonder what it would be like spending time with her, baking or just visiting. I wonder if she would be proud of me, love my kids as I do, and even share her opinion of the world as it is now.

The next text she sent said, "Mom said only use grandma's recipe. Don't trust anyone else's." Searching in haste, I still could not find a copy of my grandma's recipe.




JUST MOVED: Newcomers' 10-session class New to the area? Still feeling new? Please join us!




