

# From the desk of Fr. Sallivan

#### Dear friends,

Last week we conducted Vacation Bible School for our young children. The week was extremely enjoyable for them and for us and many have said they already can't wait until next year. I have a feeling this initiative will continue to grow.

If authentic faith is instilled into the heart of a child at a very young age, it can sustain them for life. Authentic faith affects everything and what it does. Every important decision is made through this beautiful life-giving lens. A moral foundation is established, sin and destructive decisions are more apt to be avoided, and a charitable, forgiving heart in imitation of Christ's heart is fostered.

Children who grow up without faith see the world differently. Without faith, the world and all of humanity can still be seen as beautiful. Great goodness can be lived and experienced... However, only with faith is the deeper meaning and purpose of life and especially the after-life realized. Embedded into the heart of every human person is the desire to know the deeper realities of life, but too often we seek these deeper realities strictly in an earthly and human way, missing the supernatural.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ says, "Let the little children come to me for to such as these belong the kingdom of heaven (Mt. 19:14)." We are not called to a childish faith, rather to a childlike faith with an innocence and openness that children naturally possess. We pray that these innocent hearts are never lost in our children and we pray also that those of us who are adults live in purity of life.

Part of the Basilica's basement restoration project will be dedicated to a children's play area. If a child begins to experience going to church as not only a time to worship God, but also a time to be with other children in a holy and healthy place, then church becomes as normal as school, sports, and every other enjoyable activity, with the great difference being that the church will feed and sustain in a way that nothing else can. Even in our younger years, God gives us the wisdom to realize that everything else in life at one time or another fades, but love and faith can continue to grow.

I want to thank Jackie Tiul for coordinating Vacation Bible School. She had so many helpers, too many to mention. Thanks to Kristine Putetti for her many hours of assistance, Nadine Merancy, Kerry Stewart, Noah Ryan and many others. Nearly 25 middle school and high school students also volunteered. We are most grateful to all.

May all of us continue to grow in our faith and love, and possess that beautiful gift of childlike innocence.
