From the desk of Fr. Sullivan

Dear Friends,

It's been just over one month since "Our Father's Ride" benefited our beautiful school, Catholic Academy. Other than two sections of the route that were somewhat dangerous to ride, for reasons of safety, the bike was put in my brother's truck and I was able to ride to Canaan CT. The entire distance was 205 miles. We left just after 4am at the point where Rousses Point NY and the Canadian border meet. The day was peaceful and fortunately there was little wind to fight.

My love for long-distance riding came from my mother who in 1948 at the age of 17, along with her 21-year old sister rode to Montreal from South View Street in Waterbury. Her new 3-speed Rudge bike, heavy enough to do arm curls with, also took them from Montreal to Provincetown Cape Cod. From my youngest years, I saw this as an amazing adventure and the same desire was placed in my heart. Keep in mind that my mom and aunt had no cellphones, GPS or credit card. They simply had a map and planned ahead to stay at youth hostels.

For those who love riding and are also prayerful, long distance riding is just that, a time of prayer and reflection. Riding can be a reflection of life itself with its ups and downs, mountaintops and valleys, beautiful scenery as well as potholes. One is reminded that we don't get very far without hard work but we must also remember that we need to stop from time to time smell the roses.

The hardest part of a ride of this length is not mile 205. Yes, there are some aches and pains at the end, and sitting on the saddle for countless hours can become somewhat monotonous to say the least. The thought of a warm shower and delicious pasta dinner often comes to mind. The hardest part of the ride, believe it or not, is actually around mile 125. There is still a fair amount of distance to go and is generally during the heat of the day. This is the point where a certain mental resolve has to kick in because it is easy to say "I'm tired." or "This is good enough."

Every person at one point or another in their life has a mile 125 experience, those times when we may want to say, "I'm done. I can't go on. I've had enough.". These are the times in our lives when perseverance and faith gives us strength to rise again, face another day and keep going. Mental willpower is a good thing but certain events in life require much more, namely God's grace to sustain us and even help us to thrive after earthly trials. If you are currently going through a "mile 125" in your life, keep your eyes focus on God who will give you the strength. If you are currently in a beautiful, sunny, scenic place in your life, remember not to drift. This can easily happen when things are going really well. We often forget God during good times because we are not experiencing any significant need. It is an opportunity to continually express our gratitude. Thank God everyday and continue in prayer. You will need that strength of faith, when "mile 125" one day comes.

Thank you to all who supported the ride. I'm pleased to announced we raised over \$30,000. If you still want to support Our Father's Ride 2021, your kind generosity is most welcome. Our wonderful principal, Mrs. Christa Chodkowski, our staff and school children also thank you.
