
OUR LADY OF REFUGE, Orchard Lake MI



Jesus Is Headed Your Way

One day, we heard the news that a possible tornado was heading our way. We live off a highway, and it was traveling along that very road. My wife and kids huddled in the downstairs bathroom. Not many tornadoes surface in North Carolina, so our children were particularly worried because it was something they had never contemplated happening before. The tornado never did come into our neighborhood, but it did cause one of our sons to express that he needed to go to Confession as soon as possible. He hadn't done anything too over the top sinful, but coming face—to—face with a tornado had cause him to have some second thoughts about his preparedness for meeting God. Hopefully, a tornado doesn't make a path through your city or town this Advent.

Sometimes, reminders of our mortality find their way into life. The passing of a loved one, a car accident, or a health scare can all cause us to reflect on where we are in our relationship with God. Without those moments, we can find ourselves living daily without a mindfulness of where God is in our life and if our actions are pleasing to Him...or if they drag us further away into the world. Advent is the time to take inventory of where we are with God. How are we living as good stewards and mature disciples? What do I need to make amends for in the healing power of the sacrament of Penance? A tornado may not be coming, but Jesus will be returning someday. Hopefully, you will run outside of your home to meet him, and he won't find you huddled up afraid in your bathroom.

Unleash the Gospel – Living and Sharing the Good News Sunday, December 1, 2019 - First Sunday of Advent

Brothers and sisters: You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. (Romans 13: 11-12)

Day- by- Day Advent Experiences for Evangelists

Sunday, Day One – Resolve to bring light into the dark places of life this week as you focus on being attentive to the needs of others.

Monday, Day Two – "Lord, I am not worthy" is a quote from the centurion in today's Gospel. God is letting us know that he is inclusive and that no one is excluded from his guest list. Be inclusive and let people know their worthiness.

Tuesday, Day Three - On this feast of St. Frances Xavier, follower of St. Ignatius of Loyola, practice the Ignatian Daily Examen, examining your life for that day and continue the following days. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you see your life as God sees it.

Wednesday, Day Four - Today's Gospel centers on the story of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Contribute you time and/or money to feed those in need during this cold Advent season.

Thursday, Day Five – Psalm 118 in today's liturgy says to: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever". Be attentive to all of God's blessings today and say- "Thank you God"- often.

Friday, Day Six - On this feast day of St. Nicholas plan to purchase gifts for those listed on the "Giving Tree" tags.

Saturday, Day Seven - Today's Gospel tells us that: "the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest". Pray that you and others will answer the call to proclaim the Gospel and build the Kingdom of God on earth.

Make these daily Advent practices into habits, that bring you closer to God.

Pray. Encounter. Grow. Witness.



Why Be Registered?

Are you registered at Our Lady of Refuge parish? Sometimes, people attend Mass at this parish for several years, but never officially register. Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment to the life of Our Lady of Refuge community.
