

# The Tradition of the "Nativity Scene"



Families are encouraged to set up the Christmas crib at home together so that children learn the facts of the mystery of God's love that was revealed in the poverty and simplicity of the Bethlehem Grotto. The Nativity Scene can help us understand the true meaning of Christmas because it expresses the humility and merciful goodness of Jesus Christ, who though He was rich He made Himself poor for us (2 Corinthians 8:9). Christmas brings joy, peace and hope to those who, like the shepherds in Bethlehem, accept the angel's words: "Be not afraid, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the



Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." (Luke 2: 10-12) This is still the true meaning of Christmas. We need a Savior; the Son of God came to us as a tiny infant in the poorest of circumstances. Jesus is the Savior because in Him and through Him is the grace necessary for us to overcome all of the dysfunction, sinfulness, shame and guild which separates us from God and from one another. In Him is the grace to overcome all obstacles to friendship with God. In Bethlehem "a Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord."

Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception, St Joseph, and St John Cantius!

The encounter with Jesus in Word and Sacrament defeats the malice of the Devil. I would argue that one of the biggest reasons our churches are empty is that people in general don't fear the reality of evil. If we did, we would fill the churches, since it is only here where we have that which gives victory. The Word of God and the Eucharist.

In our day and age, we have the temptation to become overly humanitarian in our approach to the faith. We care for the poor and the sick, but we don't fear the malevolence of the Devil. We provide a friendly and caring atmosphere, but we don't feel the Devil is a threat. We look at church as a social gathering, and not a place of spiritual combat of Good over Evil.

God has made us for union. It is in Church where we experience Union with God. It is here that we hear His word and consume his Body. Prayer and frequent visits to the church are thus necessary so as to stay in constant Union with God.

We desire union so badly, that we will consume something or someone if we don't find union in God. Think about this in a sin you struggle with. Why do you have such a strong desire for your sin? What are you yearning for? What union are you desiring? What desire are you trying to fulfill?

God has an answer for this. God allows us to consume Him in both Word and Sacrament. If we don't give ourselves entirely to God, we will then seek union in someone or something else. We will then desire to consume a thing or a person. We will try to find happiness in a union outside of God. This explains why a person addicted to drugs or to a sexual sin, repeatedly falls for their vice. But if they were to seek union with God, they would find peace, because here in this Church God gives himself to us in Word and Sacrament. We physically consume the Body of Christ, because God knows that we need union. We are built for union. We crave union so badly, that if God did not give himself to us, we would never have hope in overcoming sin.

The Holy Mass is the location where we are united to God. Please encourage your family and friends to attend Mass every Sunday. Untold graces are present at each and every Holy Mass. Thank you for the beautiful blessing of shepherding your parishes! I am definitely keeping you all in prayer!
