

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Adults inquiring about the Catholic Church with a desire to become Catholic are invited to call the Parish Center for information.

SPONSORSHIP: To act as Godparent for Baptism or sponsor for Confirmation, the sponsor must be a baptized Catholic, confirmed, received communion, and live a morally good life; and, if married, done so within church law. Ordinarily, the sponsor must be at least 14 years old. A Christian who is a non-Catholic may be a witness for Baptism together with a Catholic sponsor.

Sacraments

BAPTISM: Baptism is celebrated twice a month at 1:00 PM on the first and third Sunday at St. Brigid Church, Please arrange for the obligatory preparation session by calling the Parish Center.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: The Holy Eucharist and the Anointing of the Sick are available to the sick and shut-ins upon request.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, **CONFIRMATION:** Children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their family life, to worship regularly at Sunday Mass, and to receive ongoing religious education in the years preceding the reception of these sacraments.

MATRIMONY: Specific times are set for the celebration of marriage during the year. To allow ample time for preparation, please contact the Parish Center at least one year before the intended wedding

MASS GUIDELINES

If you feel sick or are aware that you are positive for the COVID 19 virus, please stay home and do not come to church. For those who are elderly or those with other health conditions, you may also choose to remain at home and watch the Mass on our website www.sainteb.org or on television (EWTN).

Please note that admittance to Mass will be based on a "first-come, first serve" basis and ALL are expected to wear personal face masks upon entering the church.

Please bring sanitizers to use for your personal space in the church.

Once you have arrived at your seat, please use personal discretion to distance yourself from others safely about 6 feet in every direction. Take note of designated sitting areas. Of course, this "distancing" does not apply to family members or those who accompanied you to church.

Missalettes and Hymnals have been removed as per Diocesan regulations to avoid multiple people touching the same book. There will be disposable worship aids with the readings available in the back of Church. Please discard after use.

It is also suggested that the congregation not sing so as to minimize the amount of breath/saliva expelled while in church.

Holy Communion will be distributed immediately following Mass. As you approach the sanctuary for Holy Communion, please allow 6 feet between yourself and the person in front of you. As you come up the aisle and arrive at the Communion station, please remove your mask when you are next to receive. When the host is placed on the palm of your hand and you receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, please place your mask back on. You may then leave the church in silence.

If you wish to meet up with fellow parishioners, kindly make your way out of the church and speak outdoors.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE FROM MSGR. PULEO

My dear friends in Jesus Christ,

These past several months reminded me of the Gospel passage describing the disciples remaining "self-isolated" on the first Easter when Jesus rose from the dead. We are told: "the doors were locked for fear of the authorities" (John 20:19-20). Like those first disciples, many of us have remained "self-isolated," following the advice of the authorities, by staying in our homes for fear of the coronavirus.

Pope Francis offers appropriate advice on how we might proclaim the Good News in these challenging times: "Let us try, if we can, to make the best use of this time. Let us be generous. Let us help those in need in our neighborhood. Let us look out for the loneliest people, perhaps by telephone or social networks. Let us pray to the Lord for those who are in difficulty." I know many of you who are following this advice!

As well, our parish community is trying to use these days in the best possible way.

Those of you who pass by our Parish Center will notice that we now have a new roof. Presently, a long overdue project, the air conditioning & heating system at Saint Brigid Church, is also being replaced. We also completed new sound systems in both churches and in the parish hall, as per FCC required regulations.

Our hope, of course, is that our Religious Education will soon be up and running for the fall semester. Sister Monique and the Religious Education volunteers as well as our parish staff are busy trying to prepare our facility with an environment that provides "social distancing" while making it engaging and safe at the same time.

During these summer weeks we have also been offering special First Communion Masses on Saturday afternoons. Each Mass allows 3-4 children and their families to participate in the First Communion celebration. We hope to offer something similar in the Fall for our young people preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Another update concerns the Sunday Mass schedule. As you know, our daily Mass at 9 AM has been back for the past few weeks. A partial Sunday Mass schedule is also being offered including the Vigil Mass at 4:30 PM on Saturday, a 9 AM Mass on Sunday and drive-through distribution of Holy Communion at 10:30 on Sunday. Our hope is to make some additions to this schedule which would include Sunday Masses at 7:30 AM, 9:30 AM (at St. Brigid) and 10:30 AM (at St. Elizabeth) with the drive-through distribution of Holy Communion at 10:45 AM beginning the weekend of September 12-13, 2020. Please let me know what you think about this proposed schedule.

As we move forward during these challenging times, please continue to pray that we do so as faith-filled followers of Christ, never afraid of anything. Why? Because Jesus always has our back. In the words of Saint Augustine: "Let us sing alleluia here on earth, while we still live in anxiety, so that we may sing it one day in heaven in full security."

"WALKING WITH MOMS IN NEED" INITIATIVE

New Jersey Safe Haven Law - Under the New Jersey Safe Haven Infant Protection Act a person may give up an unwanted infant anonymously. The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed from unsafe abandonment. A distressed parent who is unable to care for an infant can give up custody of a baby less than 30 days old safely, legally and anonymously. All that is required is that the baby be brought to any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squads in New Jersey that are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. If the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required. The parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline - 1-877-839-2339 - and get the address and directions for any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squad in the state.
