OPPORTUNITY FOR SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

Sr. Charlotte Flarlong, SSND, has a masters degree in pastoral studies and certification in spiritual direction from Aquinas Institute of Theology in St. Louis, MO. She has served as pastoral associate at Our Lady of the Ozarks in Forsyth, MO for the past nine years and will be moving to Springfield in fall 2020. Sr. Charlotte is available for individual and group direction as well as for reflection days for various parish groups in southwest Missouri.

Spiritual direction is the process of a director (guide) accompanying a directee (seeker) on his/her spiritual journey of growing closer to God. A spiritual director walks with a directee and assists the seeker to awaken more fully to the spiritual in everyday life, to develop a deeper relationship with God, and to explore their prayer life. In formal spiritual direction the director is a person who has been trained, supervised and certified. Meetings are usually scheduled in advance on a regular basis – usually every three or four weeks for about an hour. Fee is negotiable.

Persons seek spiritual direction, for example, when they are experiencing a new sense of God in their lives, when facing a change or transition in life, when discerning an important decision in life, when desiring to deepen their prayer life, when experiencing grief or discouragement, when feeing "stuck" in their spiritual life, or when they are sensing a new experience of God in their life.

Face-to-face spiritual direction is not possible at this time due to Covid-19. However, many individuals seek to deepen their relationship with God as they journey through the

pandemic. Sr. Charlotte is available to meet online with individuals who would like to begin spiritual direction now.
