

Next Sunday, we celebrate Priesthood Sunday, a special day set aside to honor priesthood in the United States. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the

role of the priest as central to the life of the Church.

In normal times, we would celebrate this day and Father Shoby as a parish family sharing a potluck meal and card shower. In this time of the COVID-19 pandemic, social distancing prohibits this particular way of celebrating this year. We pray that soon we can once again fully come together without boundaries and health concerns.

Until that time, let us share our appreciation for Father Shoby in other creative ways. Here are some ideas to consider:

- Give Father Shoby a spiritual bouquet. Send a card letting him know that you will set aside a day each week, once a month, etc. to pray for his protection and for God's grace to help him fulfill his role of bringing people closer to God. You can write something such as, "Father please accept this spiritual bouquet as a thank you for all you do for our parish. I will say the rosary once a month for one year for all of your special intentions."
- Send him a note of thanks detailing a specific time when he helped you or had a positive impact on your life. (For example, when one of his homilies moved you, a time when he counseled you, or just sat down and listened to you vent about a personal problem).
- Send him a flowering plant or a small tree that he can plant on the church property. Let him know that as the tree grows and thrives, that's a reflection of how he's helping his parishioners grow in their love for God.
- Give him a biography of a popular priest, saint, or pope.
- Remember, priests are regular people, too with hobbies and interests outside the church. Get him something related to his interests, whether it's golf, traveling, cooking, or art. If you aren't sure, calling the parish office for some ideas.
- Make a gift basket of baked goods, chocolates, coffee and beverages, etc.
- A gift card to a restaurant, Catholic store, or for gas, etc.

Card may be mailed to Father Shoby at the rectory (414 Griesemer Road, Billings, MO 65610) or placed next weekend in the basket in the church foyer.

All Souls' Day

WHAT IS ALL SOULS' DAY?

All Souls' Day is a celebration to remember those who have died—in particular one's relatives.

It's always on November 2 and is preceded by All Saints' Day on November 1.

Known liturgically as the "Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed", All Souls' Day is often seen as a continuation and extension of the All Saints' Day celebrations conducted the day before. While All Saints' Day is dedicated to those who are in heaven, All Souls' Day is a day of prayer for those who have died but have not yet reached heaven.

On All Soul's Day and throughout November, our parish family will remember and pray for our deceased loved ones. To include your family member(s), please list their name(s) on the **ALL SOUL'S DAY 2020** form in the vestibule, contact the church office or submit names clearly marked for All Soul's Day in the collection basket. Names will be placed at the Altar of Mary until the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Nov. 22).
